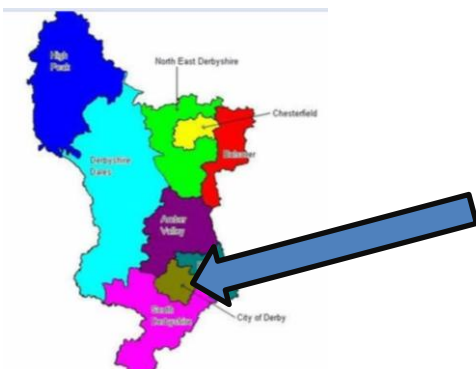

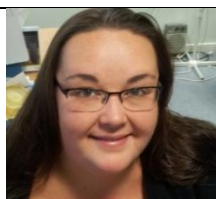


This report is about Derby City.

0.5% of people who live in Derby have a learning disability.

This is about the same as other places in England.

Derby Doctors know 1,161 people. Derby Social Services know 720 people.

March 2011, around 1 in every 200 adults had a learning disability.



Derby has more Black and Minority Ethnic people.

Derby has lots of Asian people.



More have Direct payments and council services.



The numbers who live with family and friends is about the same.

More live alone, without friends and family.



Less have a paid job.



More have health checks.



Less stay in hospital for things that are usually treated by family doctors.

More recorded going to A&E.



More use home care services.

Less people use day services.



People die at a younger age.



More are reported to the Council for poor care.



The scores for the Self Assessment Framework have got better. The Big Health Days were part of this.
