Katie couldn't always get the numbers she needed.

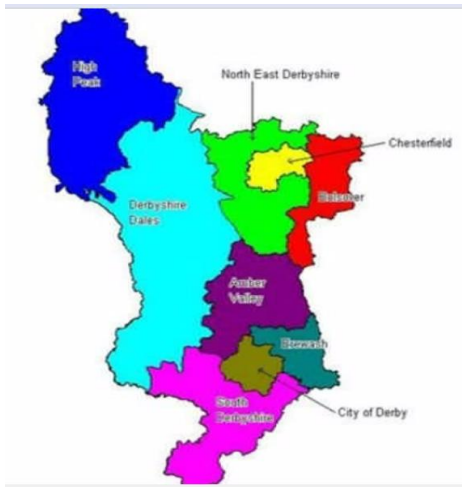
All the services use computers. Not all the computers have been told that someone has a learning disability.

People die younger than people without learning disabilities in Derbyshire.



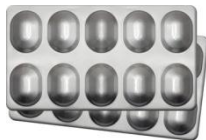
When people are reported to the Council as being abused, the name of the person doing the hurting is often not given.
