




This report is about Derbyshire County.






It tells us facts and numbers about people with learning disabilities.

0.5% of people who live in Derbyshire have a learning disability.

This is about the same as other places in England.

Derbyshire Doctors know 2904 people. Derbyshire Social Services know 1875 people.

More live with family and friends.


More live alone, without friends and family.

Less recorded going to A&E.

People die at an older age than people with learning disabilities in the rest of England.

People die younger than people without learning disabilities in Derbyshire.







When people are reported to the Council as being abused, the name of the person doing the hurting is often not given.

Compared to people without learning disabilities in Derbyshire:

More likely to have

diabetes, asthma, epilepsy mental illness Obesity

Less cervical cancer screening.



Some scores for the Self Assessment Framework have got better, most stayed the same. The Big Health Days were part of this.
