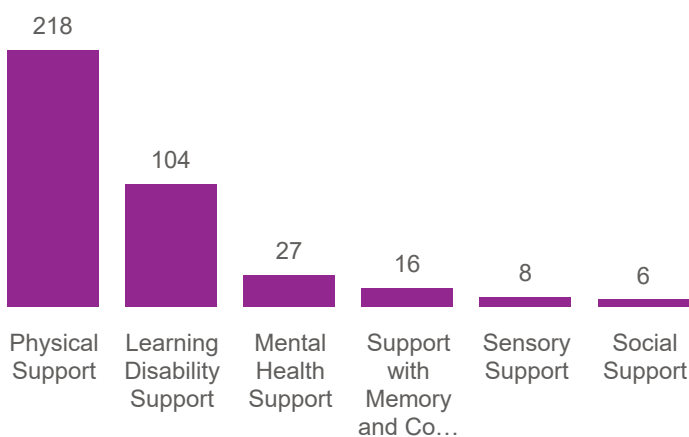


Adult Social Care users in Derbyshire 2022

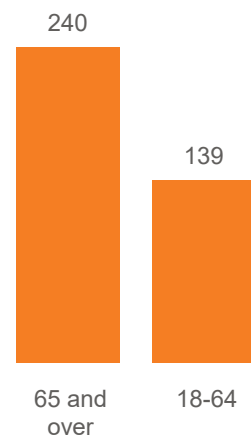
This infographic gives a summary of the ASCS survey carried out by all councils with social services responsibilities, focussing on the results for Derbyshire. It is for social care clients and staff.

- There are 9,027 people receiving social services care or support in Derbyshire, which is about 14 in every 1,000 adults in Derbyshire (Census 2021 for Derbyshire 635,657)
- In 2022 a random sample of 1265 people receiving services were sent a survey, and 398 completed it (31.5%)

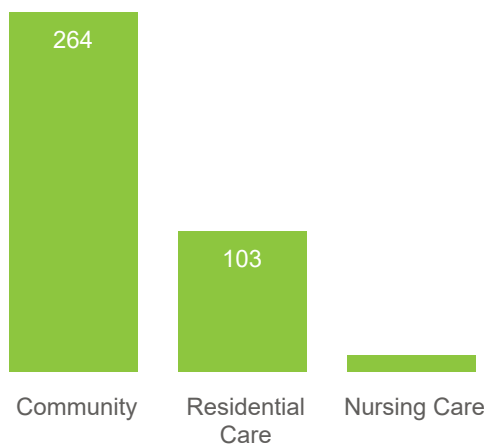
Primary Support Reason

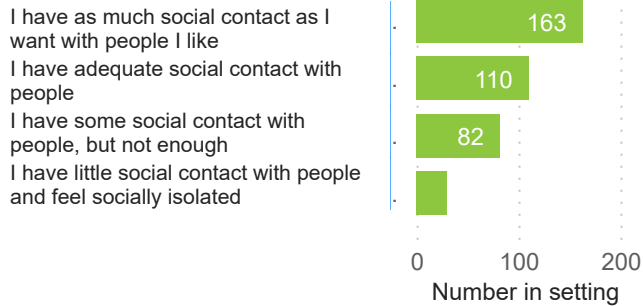
Quality of Life is a score out of a maximum of 24

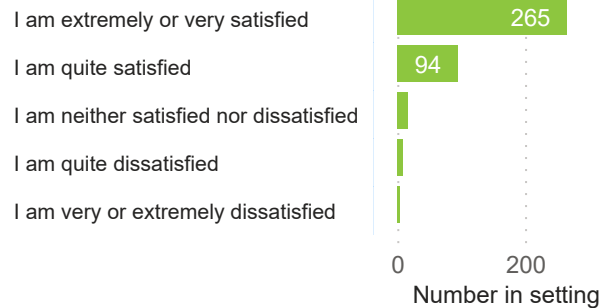

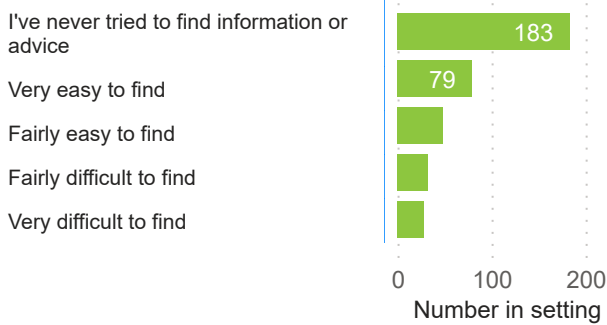
Q8a - Thinking about how much contact you've had with people you like, which of the following statements best describes your social situation?



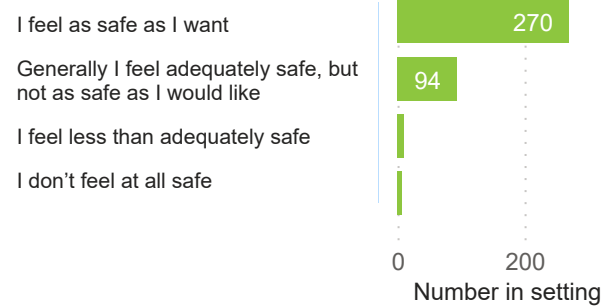
Q1 - Overall, how satisfied are you with the care and support services you receive? (Combined)



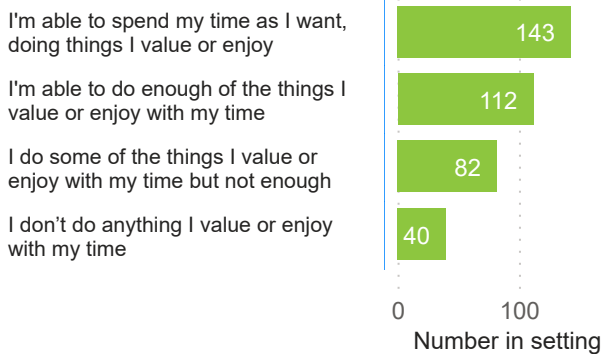
Q12 - In the past year, have you found it easy or difficult to find information and advice about support, services or benefits?



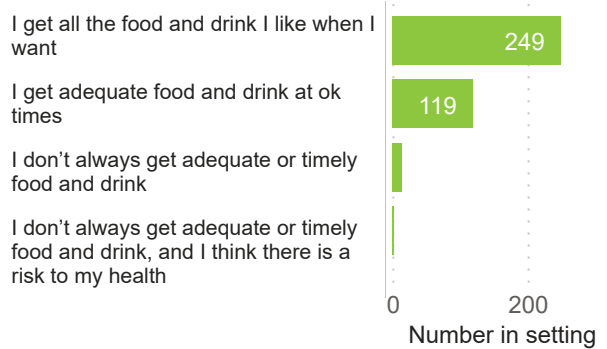
Q7a - Which of the following statements best describes how safe you feel?
