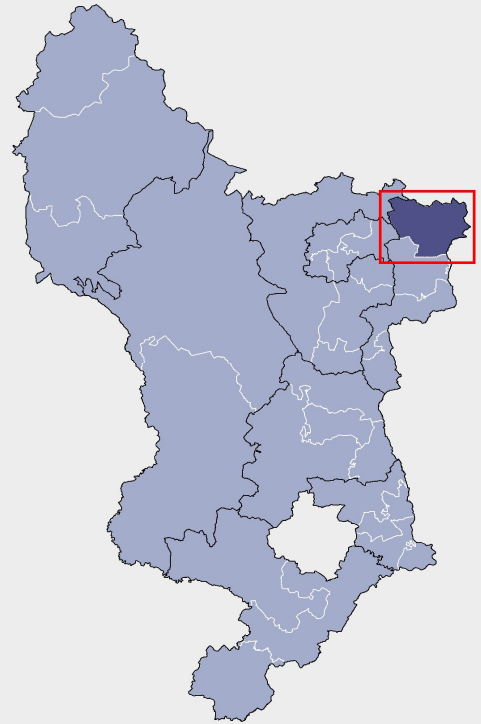
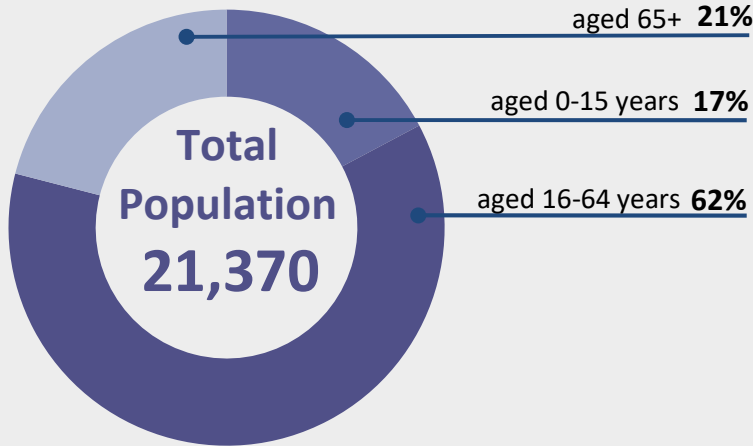


# 2018 Area Summary Profile Clowne MAT

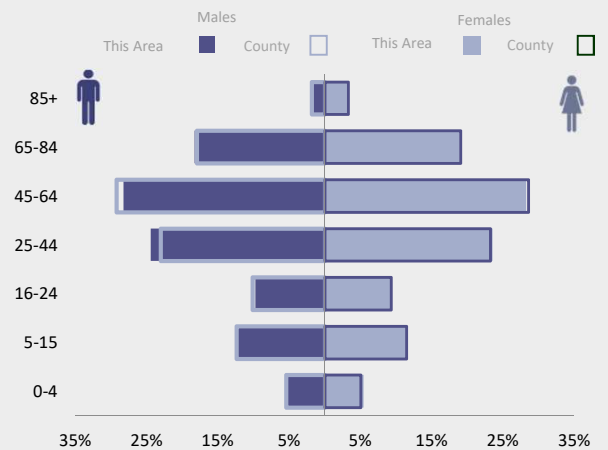

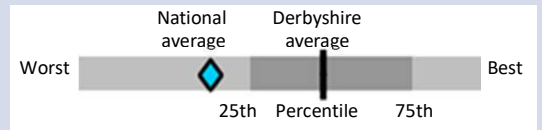
# 2018 Area Summary Profile

## Clowne MAT
