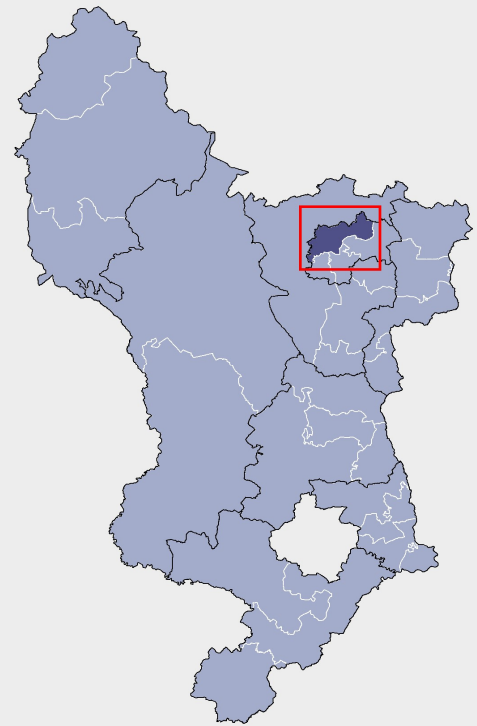
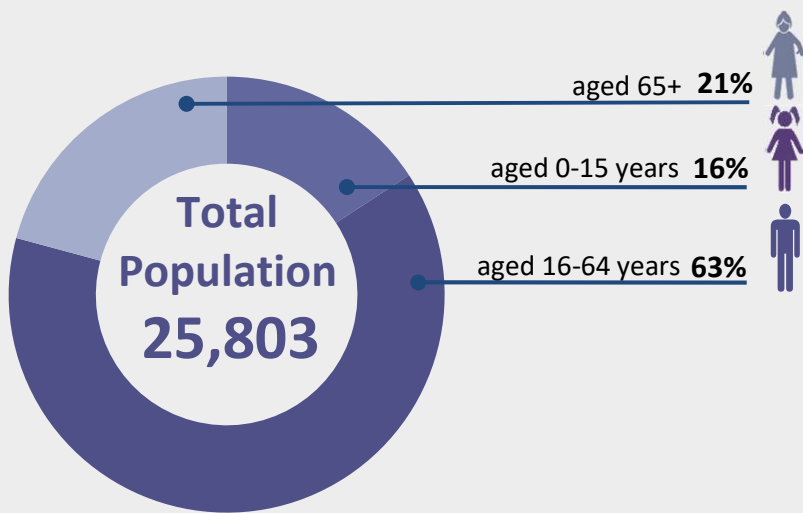


# 2018 Area Summary Profile Chesterfield North MAT

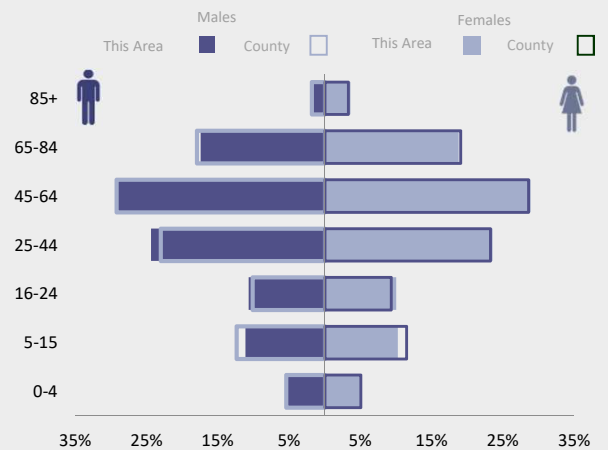


The Multi Agency Team (MAT) area of Chesterfield North is semi-urban in nature, covering the Newbold, part of Old Whittington and New Whittington.

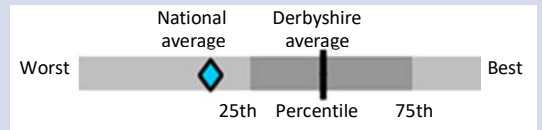

# 2018 Area Summary Profile Chesterfield North MAT



The chart below compares a range of indicators for Derbyshire. The local result for each indicator is shown as a circle against the range of results for the chosen local geography within Derbyshire's administrative boundary. The latest available figures have been used for all indicators and the significance for the results are shown by different colours as detailed below.
