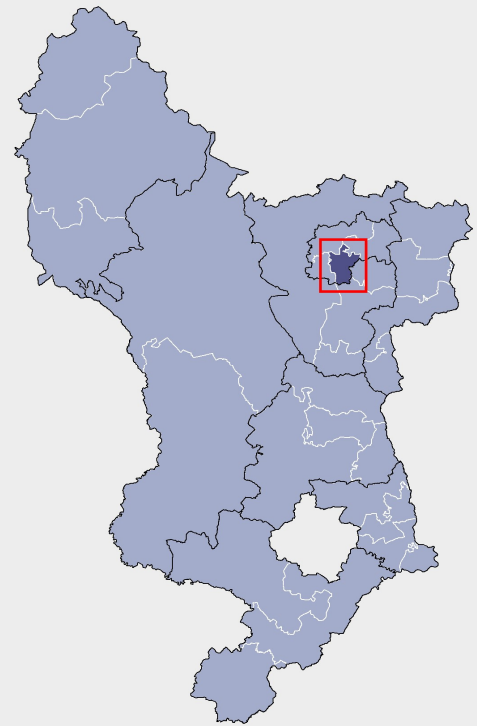
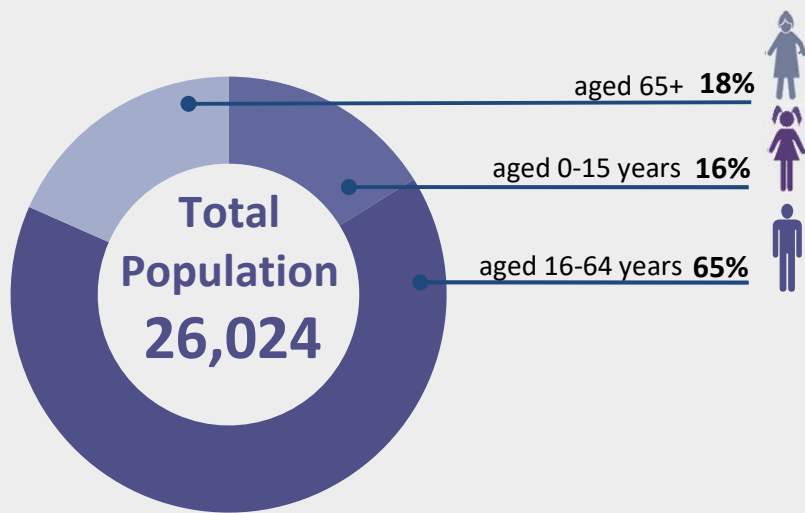

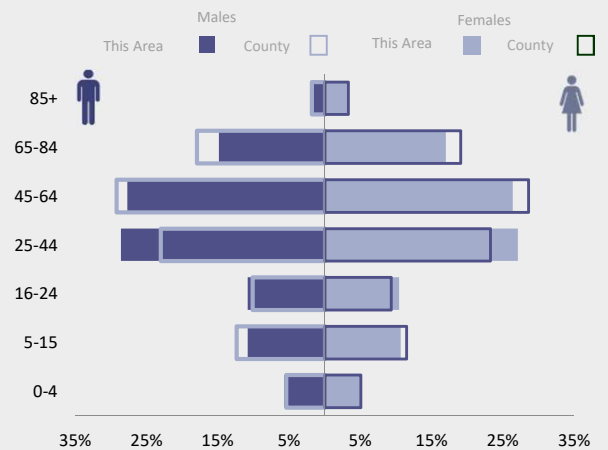


The Multi Agency Team (MAT) area of Chesterfield South is an urban area covering Hasland, Spire, Calow and part of Old Whittington.

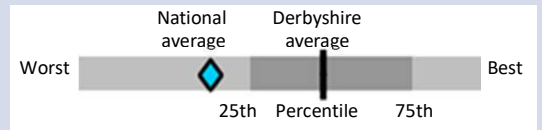

The chart below compares a range of indicators for Derbyshire. The local result for each indicator is shown as a circle against the range of results for the chosen local geography within Derbyshire's administrative boundary. The latest available figures have been used for all indicators and the significance for the results are shown by different colours as detailed below.
