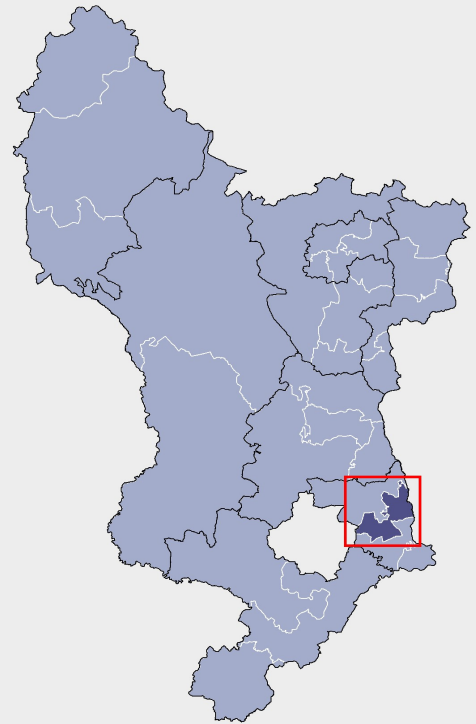
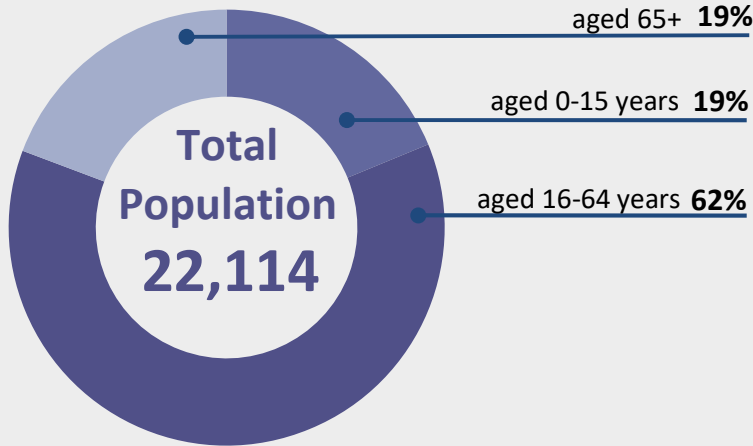


# 2018 Area Summary Profile Kirk Hallam MAT

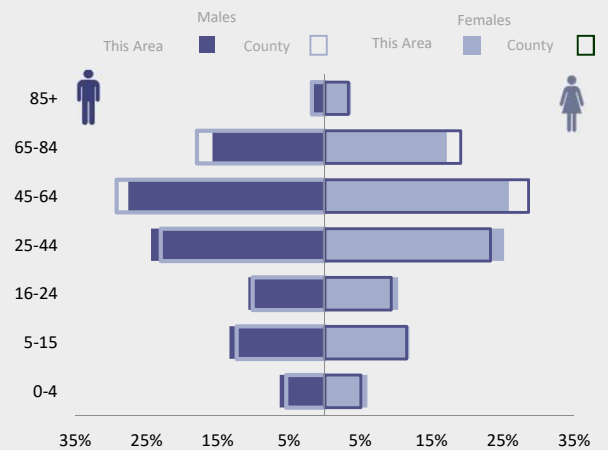

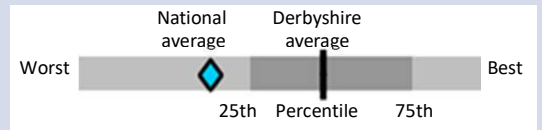
# 2018 Area Summary Profile

The chart below compares a range of indicators for Derbyshire.
