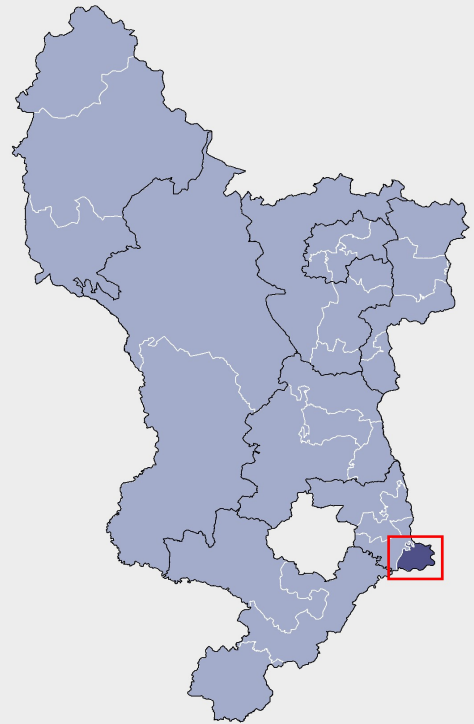
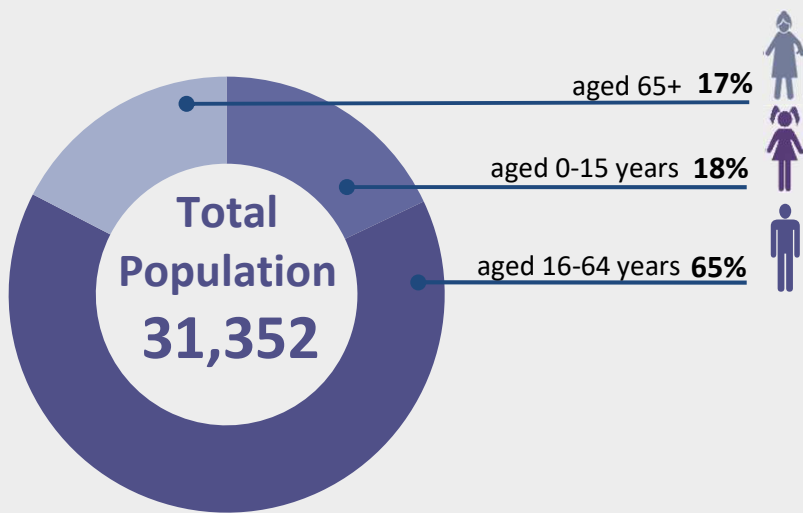


# 2018 Area Summary Profile Long Eaton MAT

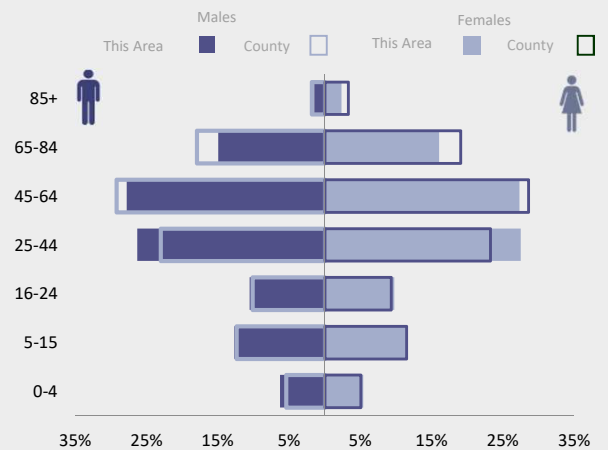


The Multi Agency Team (MAT) area of Long Eaton in Erewash is an urban area stretching out from the town of Long Eaton to include the village of Sawley.

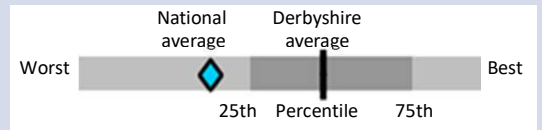
# 2018 Area Summary Profile

## Long Eaton MAT



The chart below compares a range of indicators for Derbyshire. The local result for each indicator is shown as a circle against the range of results for the chosen local geography within Derbyshire's administrative boundary. The latest available figures have been used for all indicators and the significance for the results are shown by different colours as detailed below.
