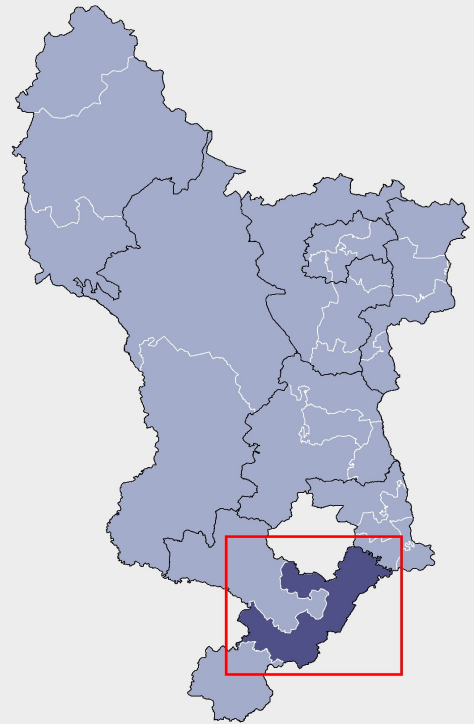
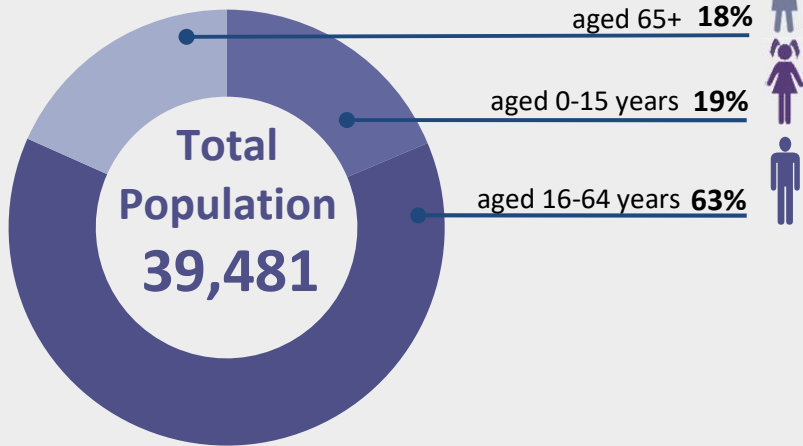


2018 Area Summary Profile Woodville & Newhall MAT



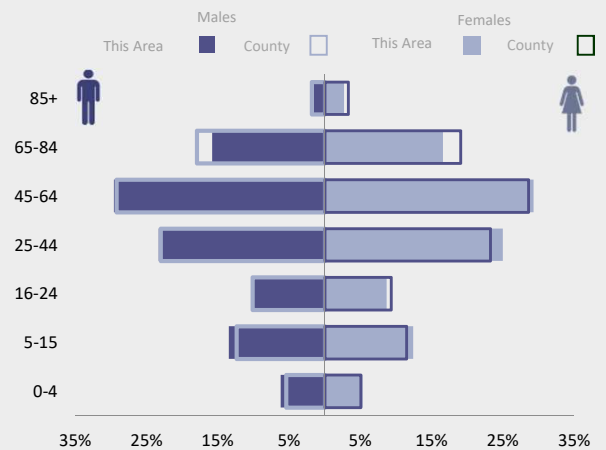

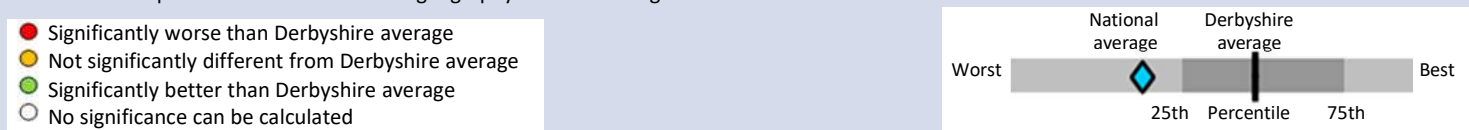
