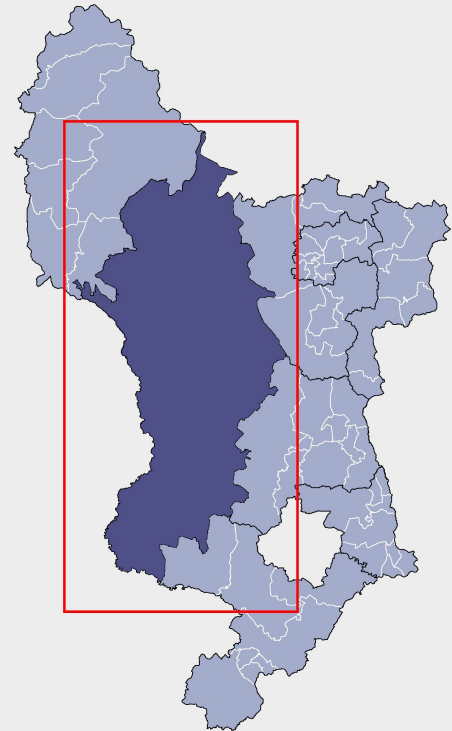
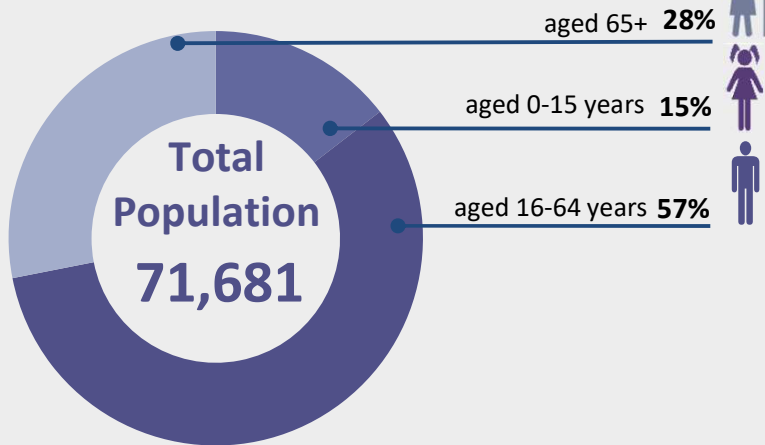


2023 Area Summary Profile Derbyshire Dales District

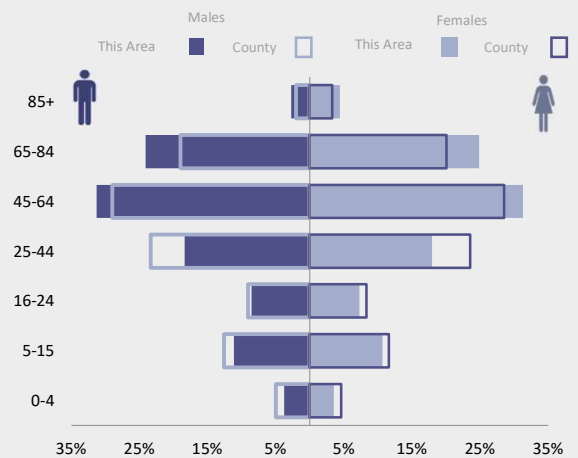

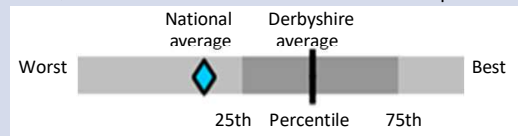

The chart below compares a range of indicators for Derbyshire.
