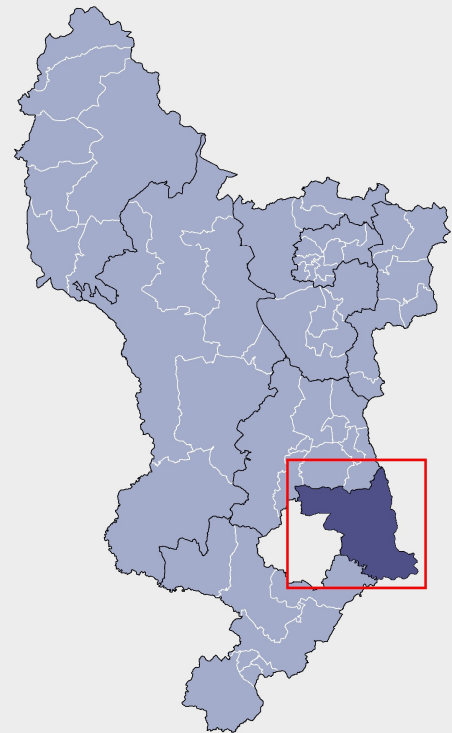
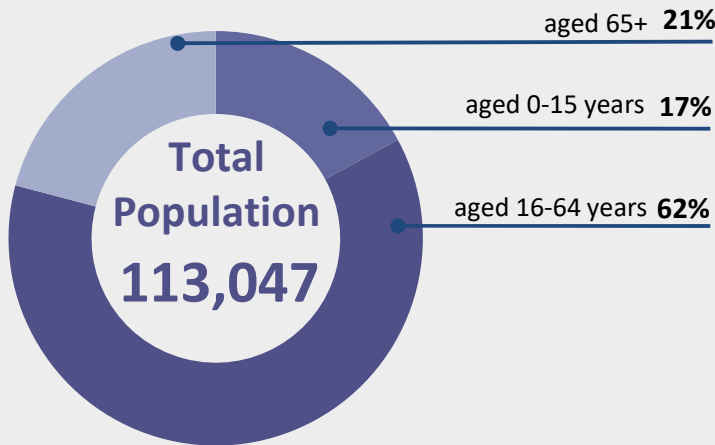


# 2023 Area Summary Profile Erewash District

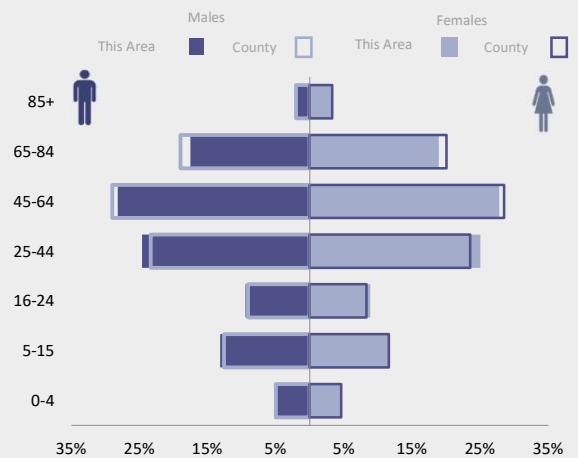

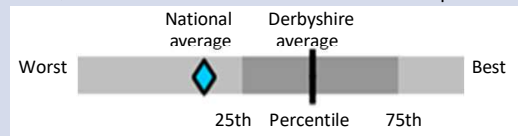
# 2023 Area Summary Profile

## Erewash District



The chart below compares a range of indicators for Derbyshire.
