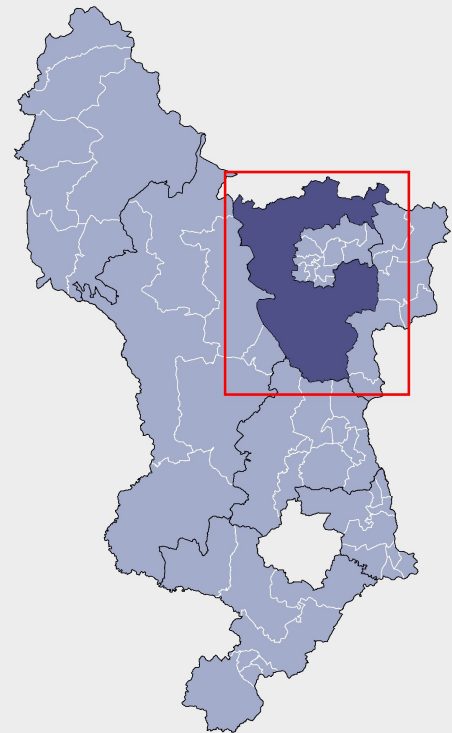
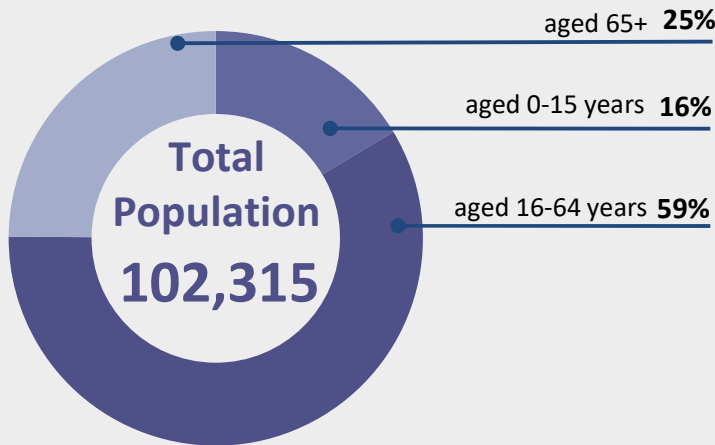


2023 Area Summary Profile North East Derbyshire District

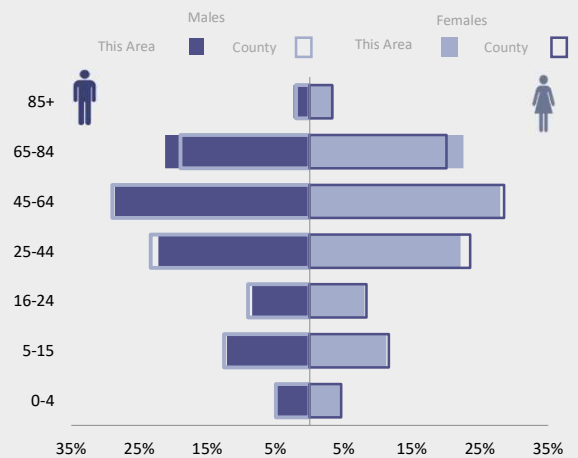

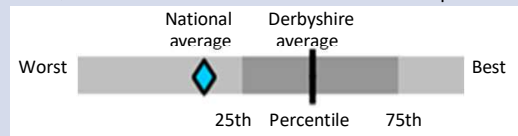
