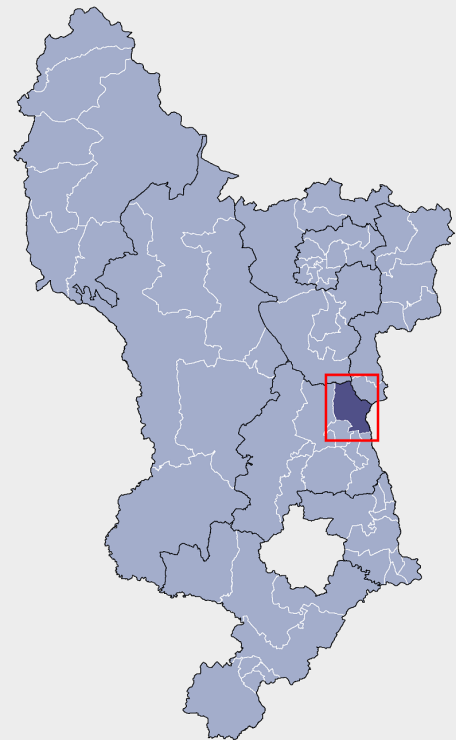
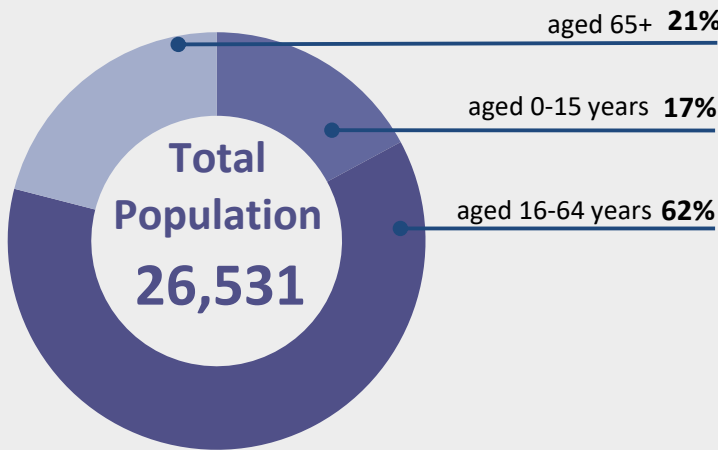

Alfreton and Somercotes Electoral Division

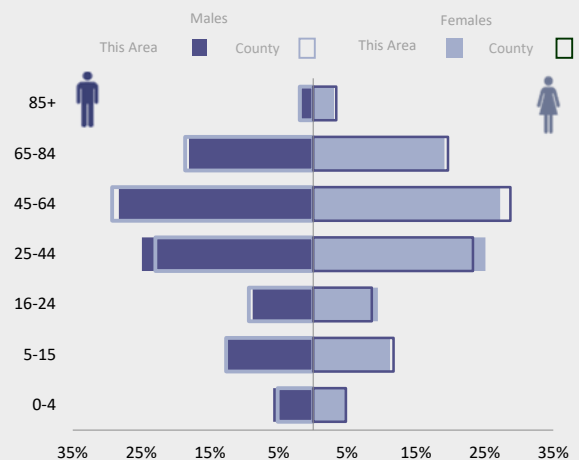

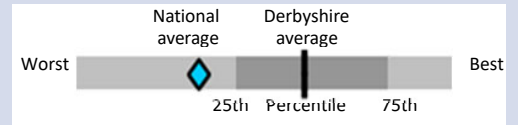
