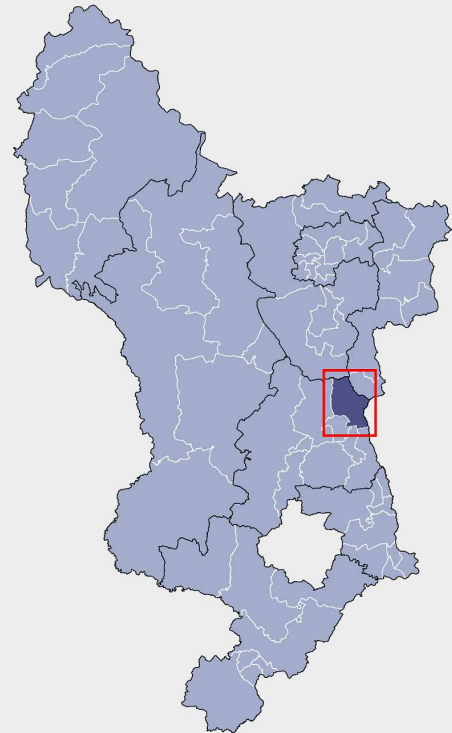
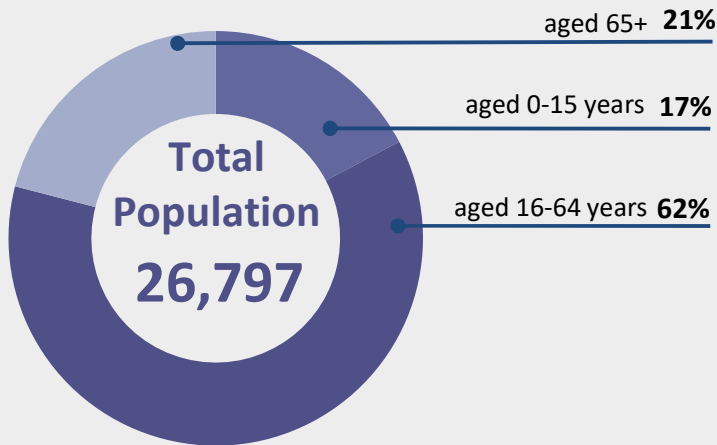


# 2023 Area Summary Profile Alfreton and Somercotes Electoral Division

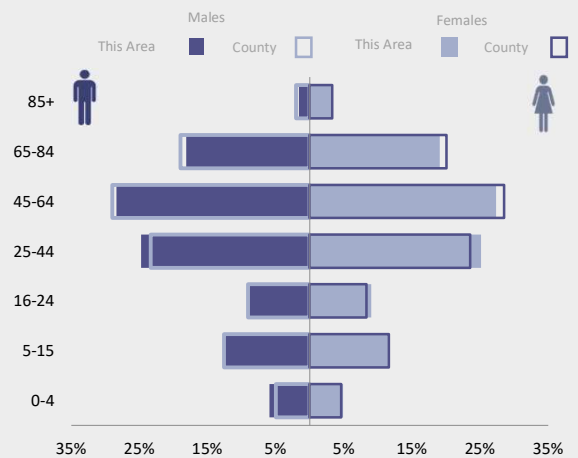

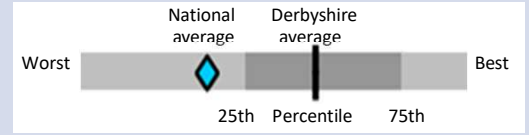
# 2023 Area Summary Profile

## Alfreton and Somercotes Electoral Division



The chart below compares a range of indicators for Derbyshire.
