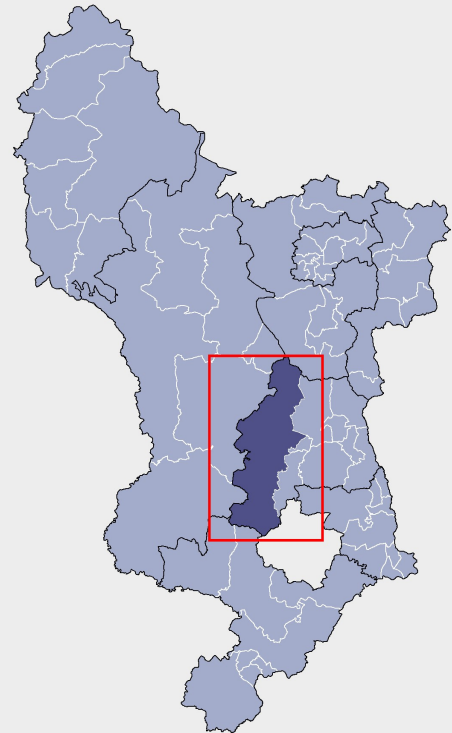
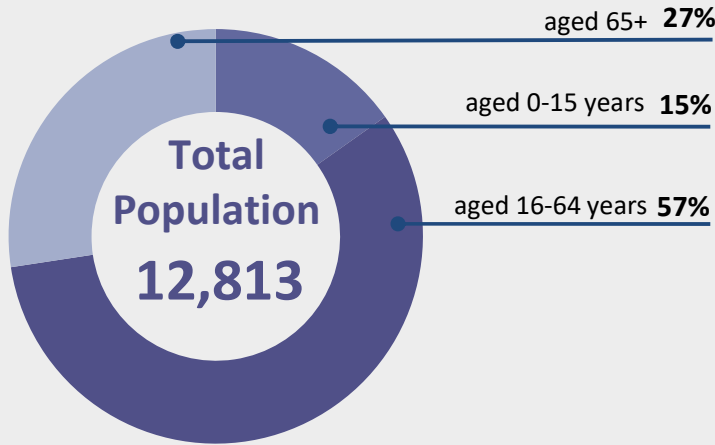


2023 Area Summary Profile Alport and Derwent Electoral Division

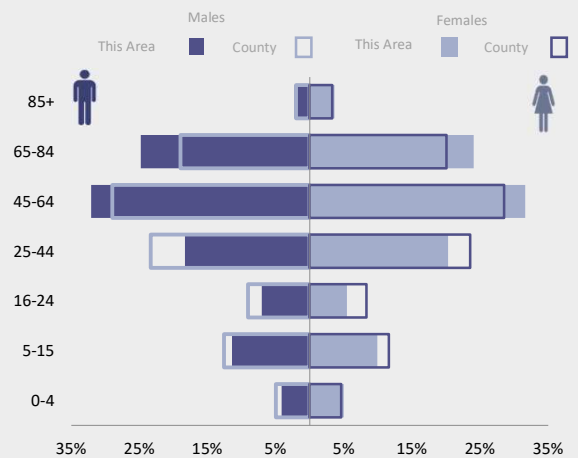

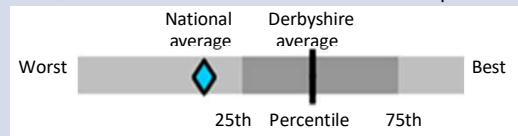
