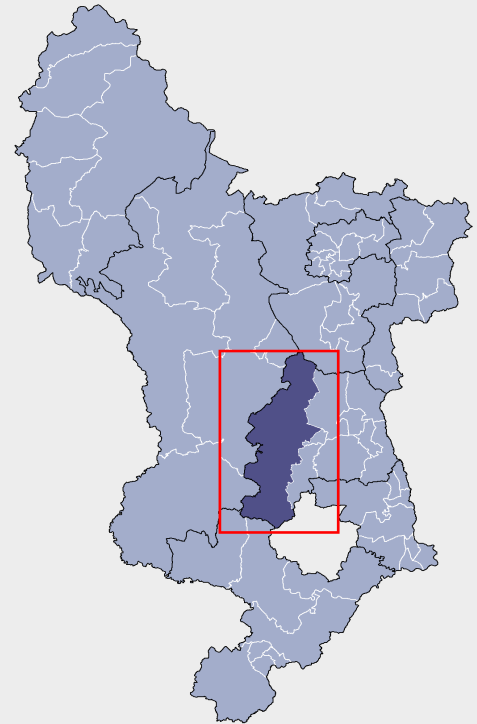
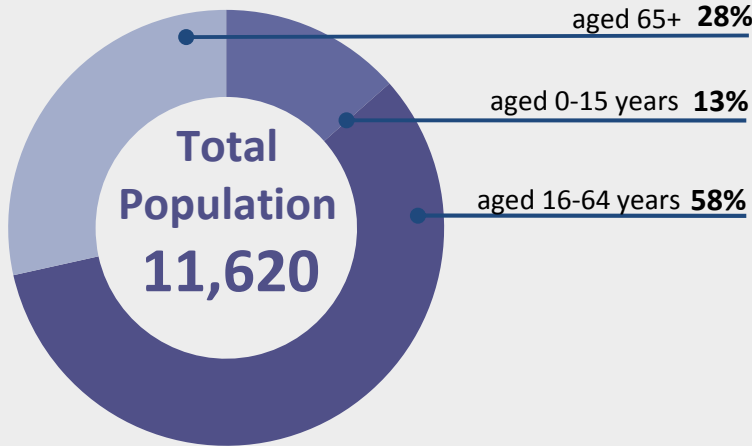


# 2018 Area Summary Profile Alport and Derwent Electoral Division

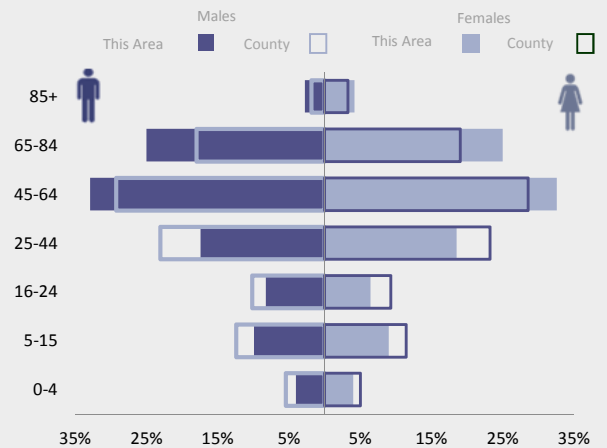

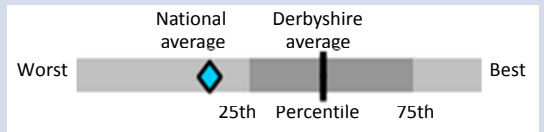

# 2018 Area Summary Profile

## Alport and Derwent Electoral Division

The chart below compares a range of indicators for Derbyshire. The local result for each indicator is shown as a circle against the range of results for the chosen local geography within Derbyshire's administrative boundary.
