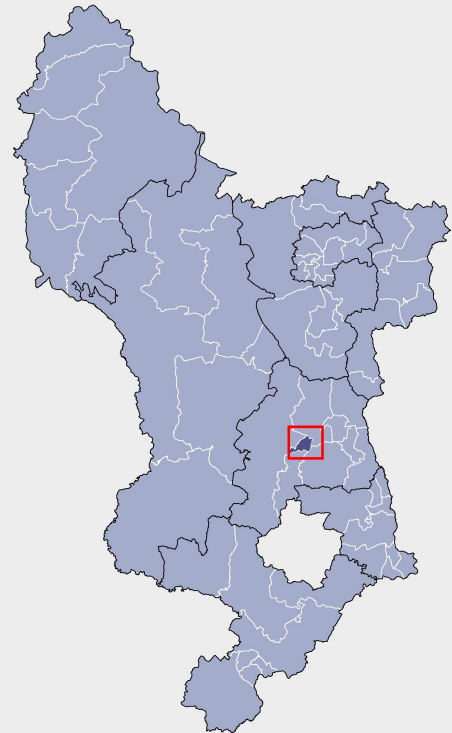
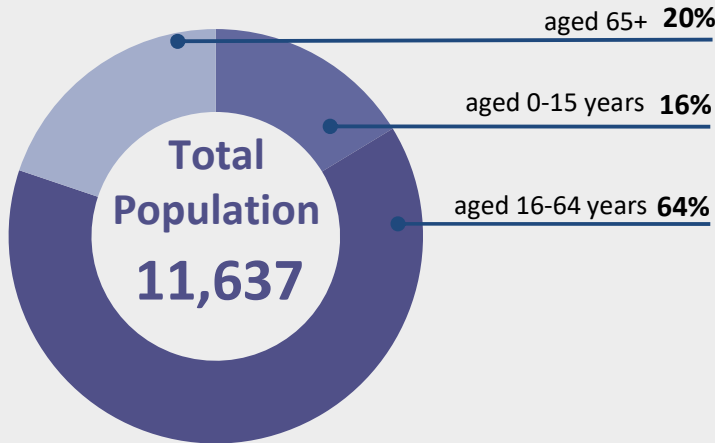


# 2023 Area Summary Profile Belper Electoral Division

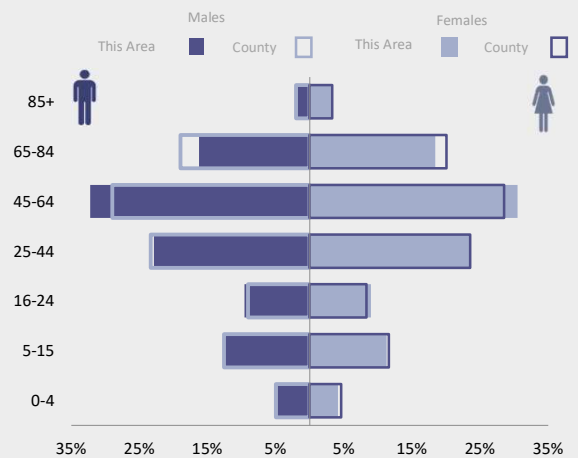


Belper electoral division is centrally positioned in Amber Valley and comprises the two district wards of Belper Town Central and Belper Town East, both urban in nature.

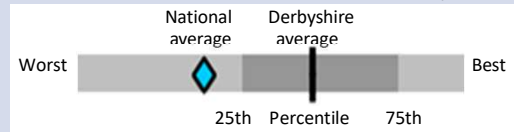
# 2023 Area Summary Profile

## Belper Electoral Division



The chart below compares a range of indicators for Derbyshire.
