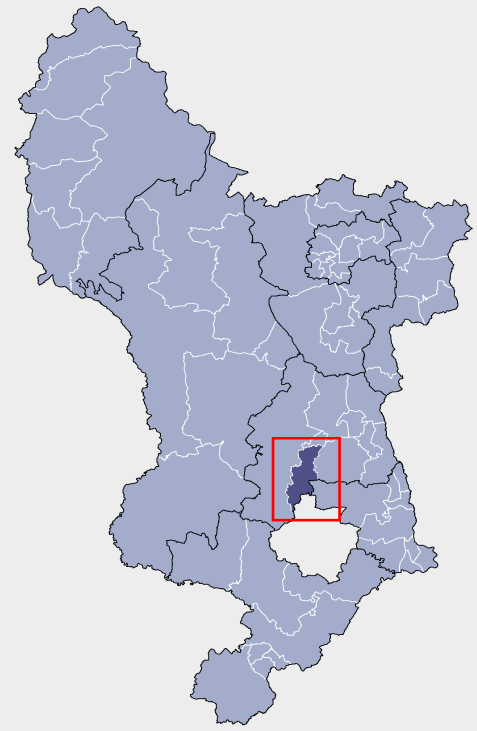
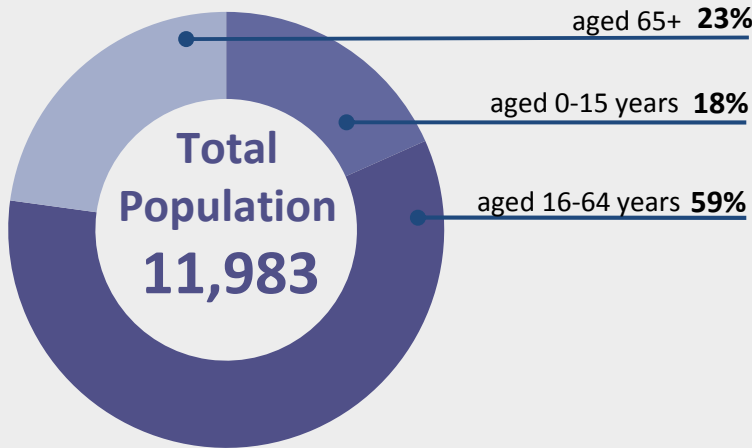

Duffield and Belper South Electoral Division

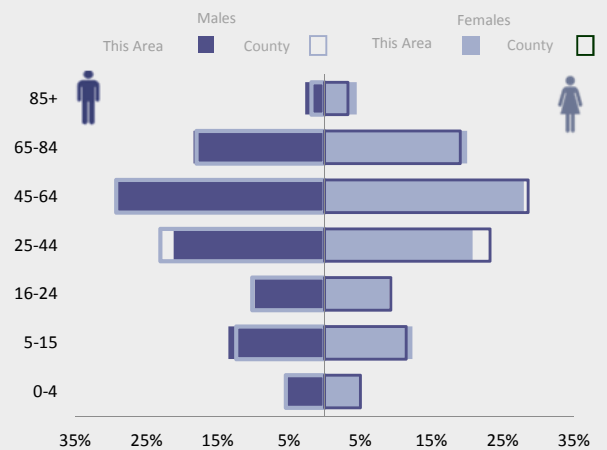

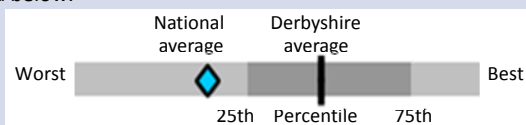
