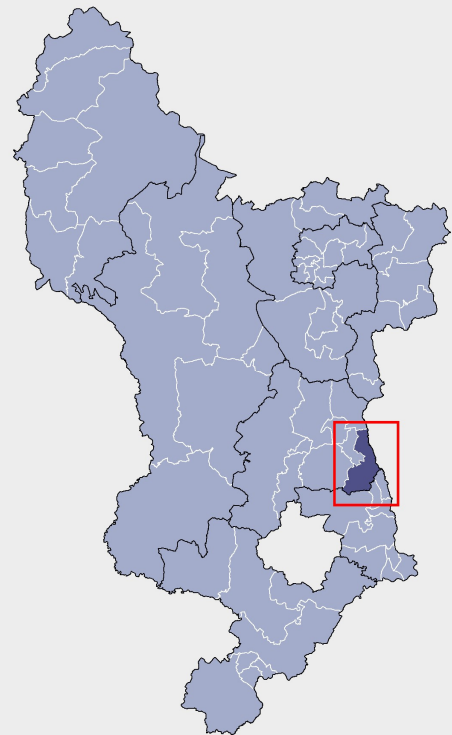
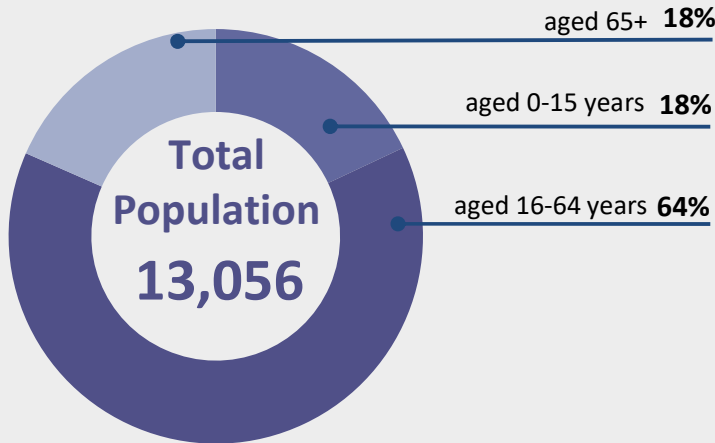


# 2023 Area Summary Profile Greater Heanor Electoral Division

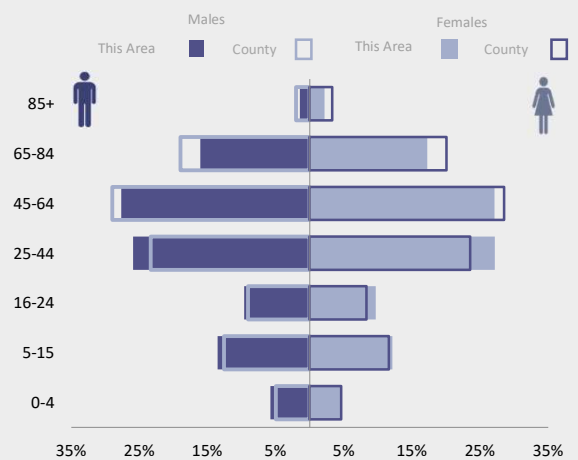

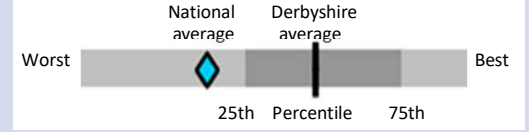
# 2023 Area Summary Profile

## Greater Heanor Electoral Division



The chart below compares a range of indicators for Derbyshire.
