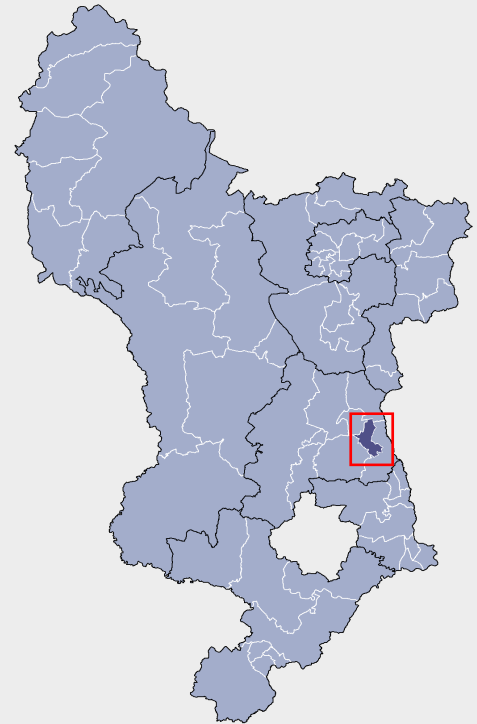
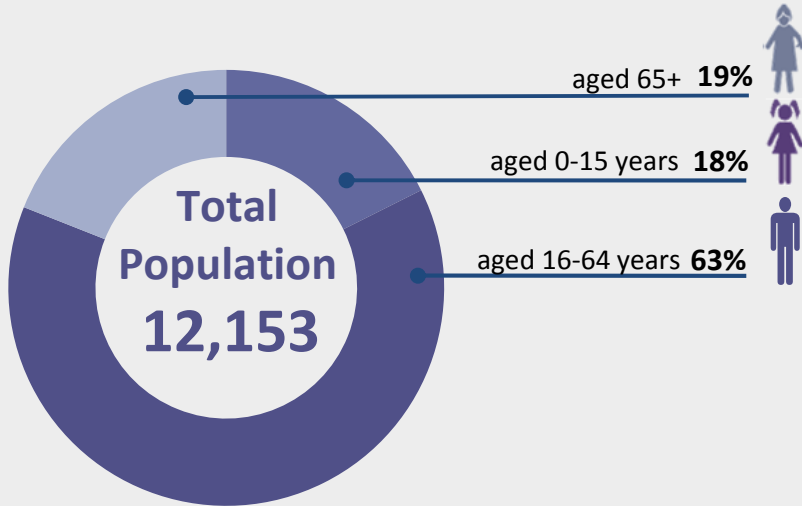


# 2018 Area Summary Profile Heanor Central Electoral Division

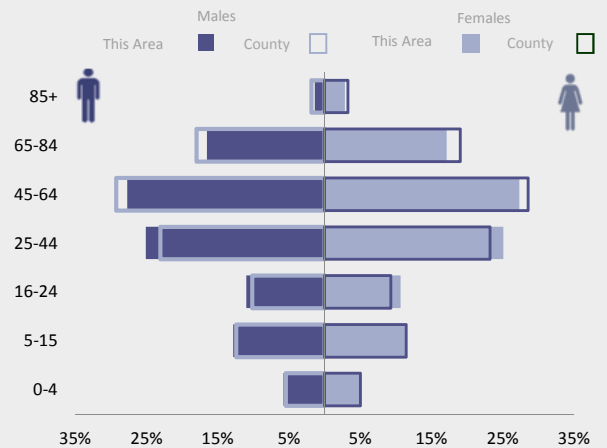


Heanor Central division lies in the east of Amber Valley. The area is urban in nature and contains the two wards of Heanor & Loscoe and Heanor West.

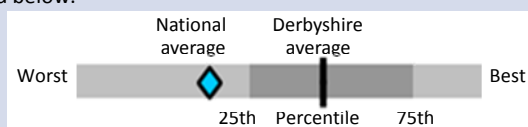
# 2018 Area Summary Profile

## Heanor Central Electoral Division
