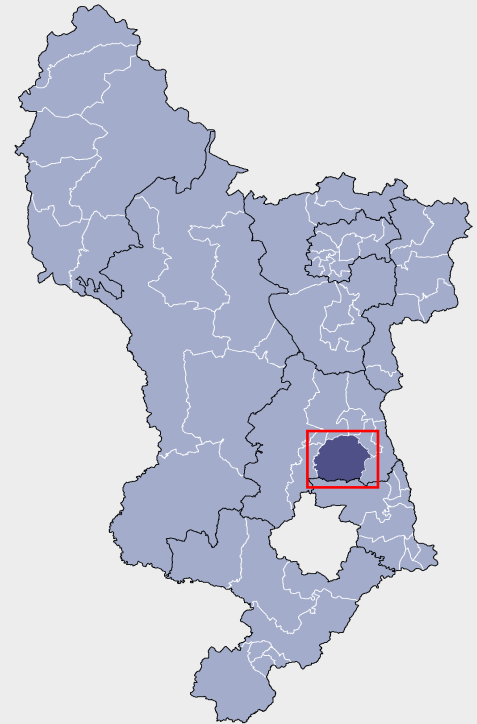
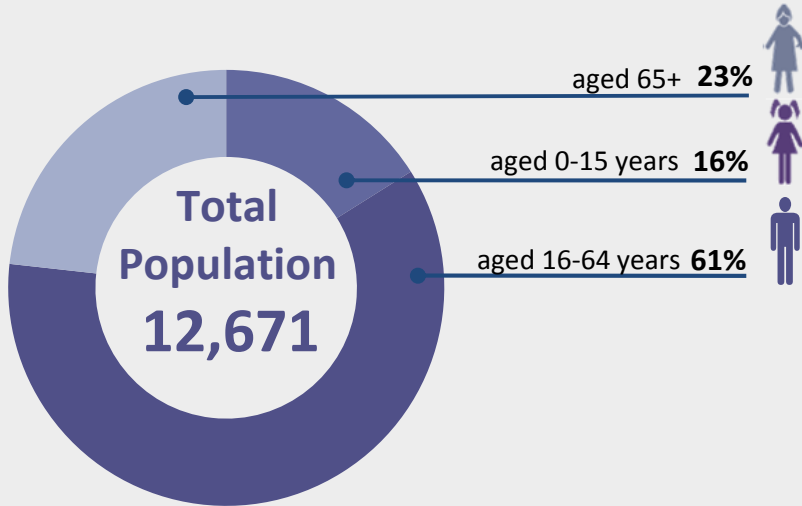


2018 Area Summary Profile Horsley Electoral Division

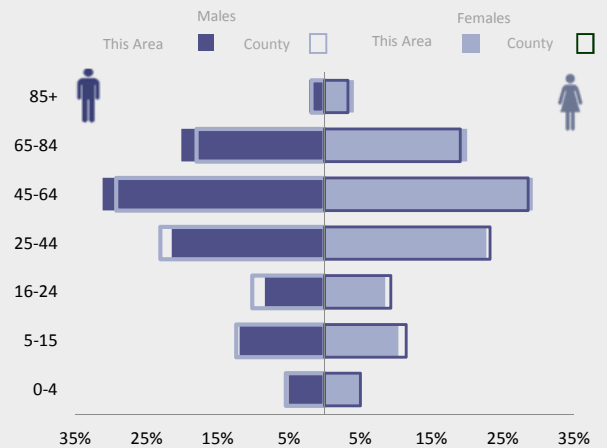

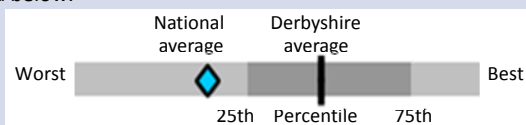
