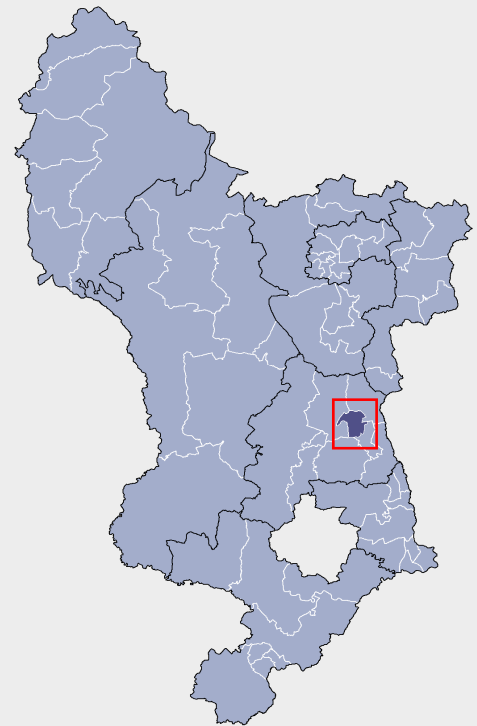
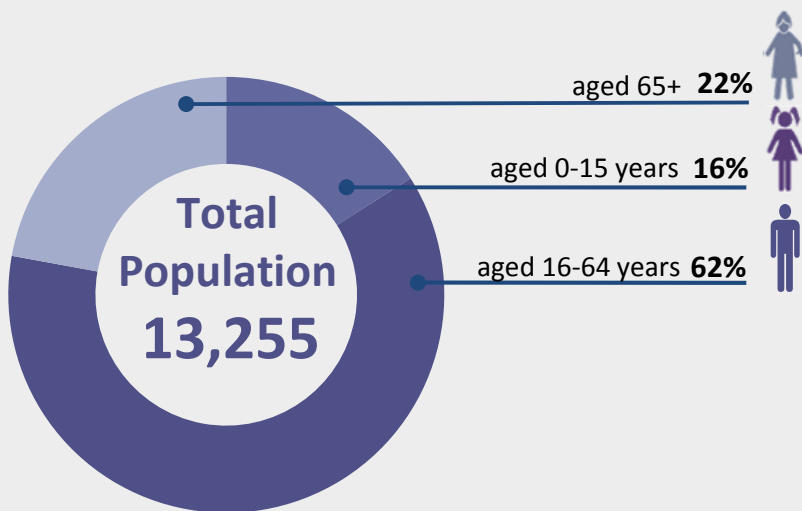

Ripley East and Codnor Electoral Division

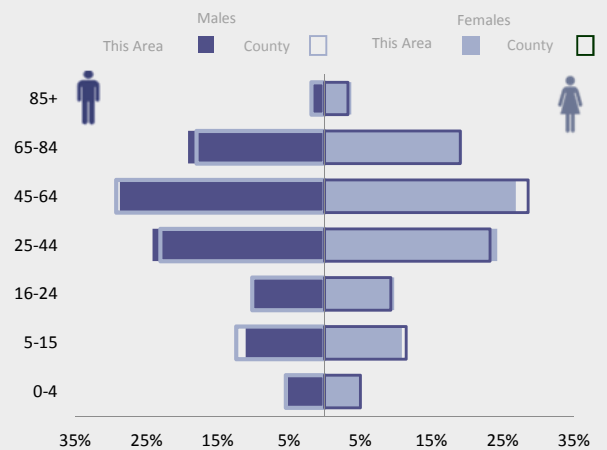


Ripley East and Codnor division is in the mid-eastern part of Amber Valley. It is an urban area that covers the two wards of Codnor & Waingroves and Ripley.

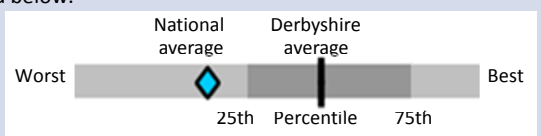
