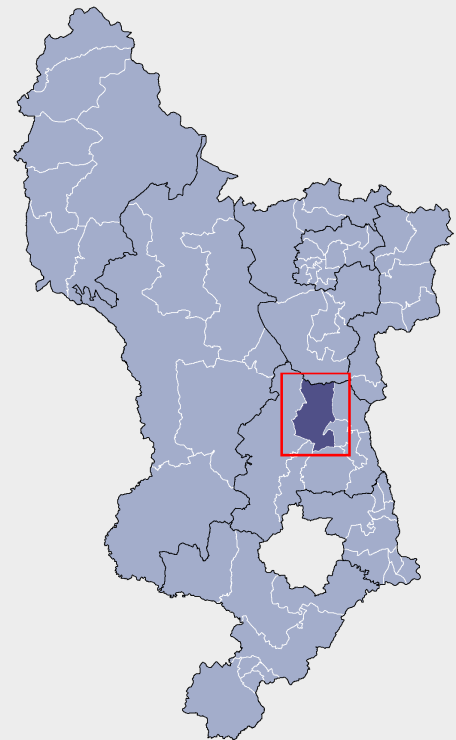
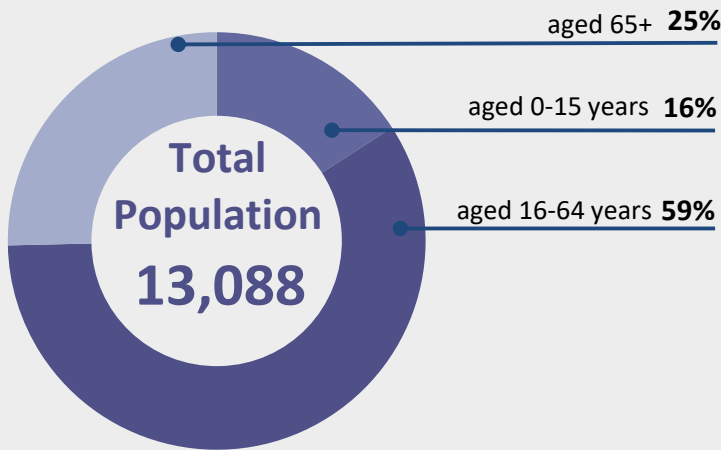


2021 Area Summary Profile Ripley West and Heage Electoral Division

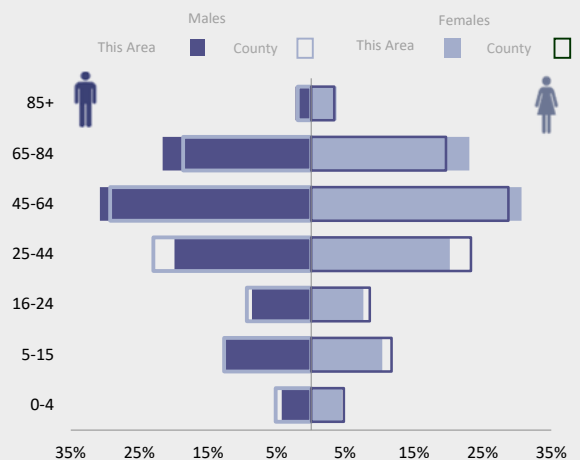

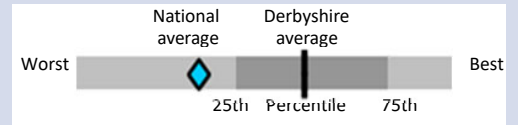

Ripley West and Heage Electoral Division
