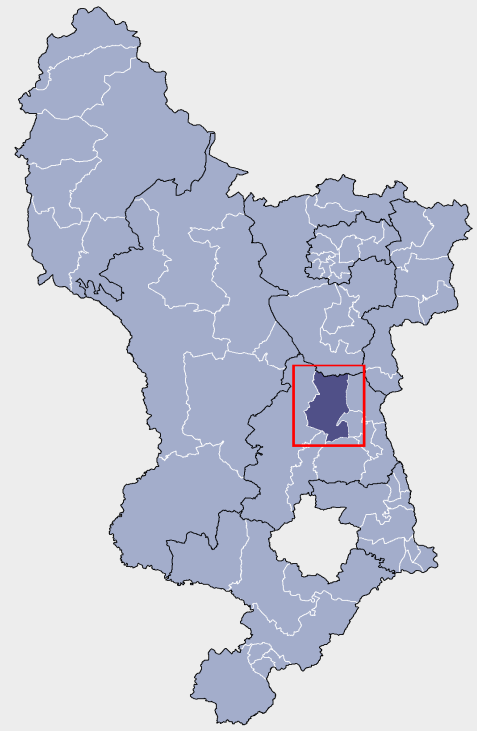
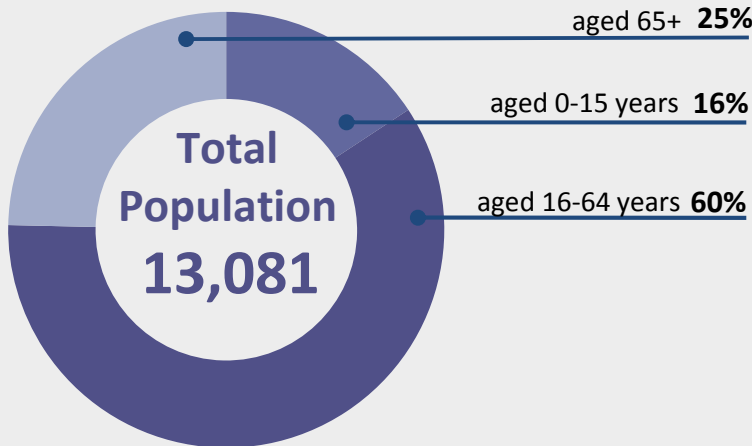

Ripley West and Heage Electoral Division

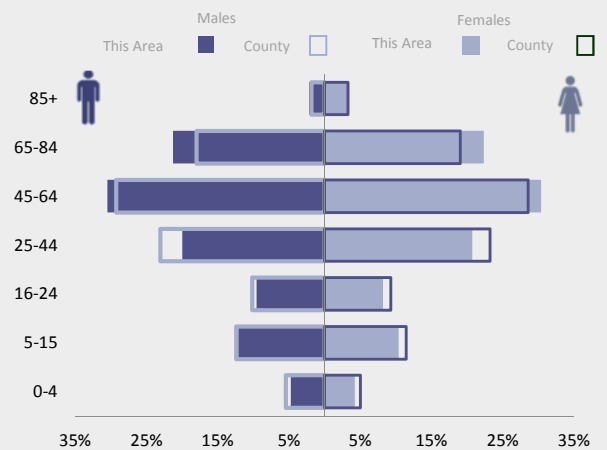

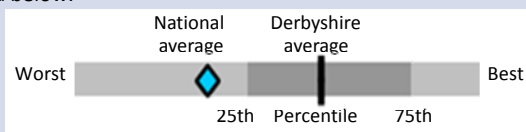
