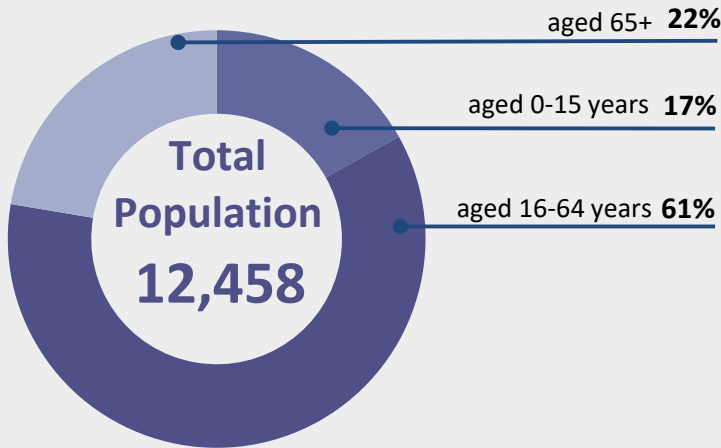
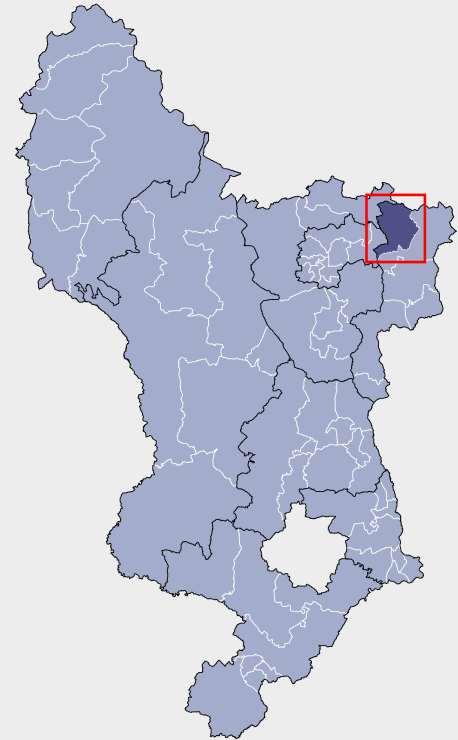


# 2021 Area Summary Profile

## Barlborough and Clowne Electoral Division

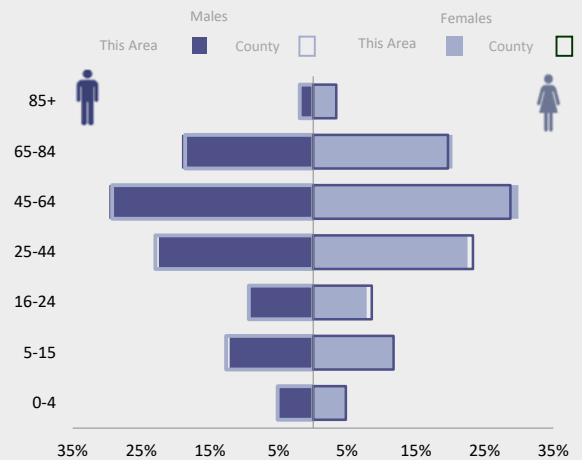

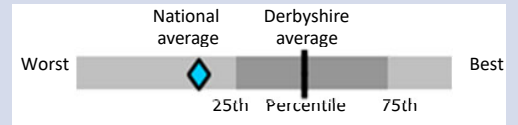

# 2021 Area Summary Profile

## Barlborough and Clowne Electoral Division

The chart below compares a range of indicators for Derbyshire.
