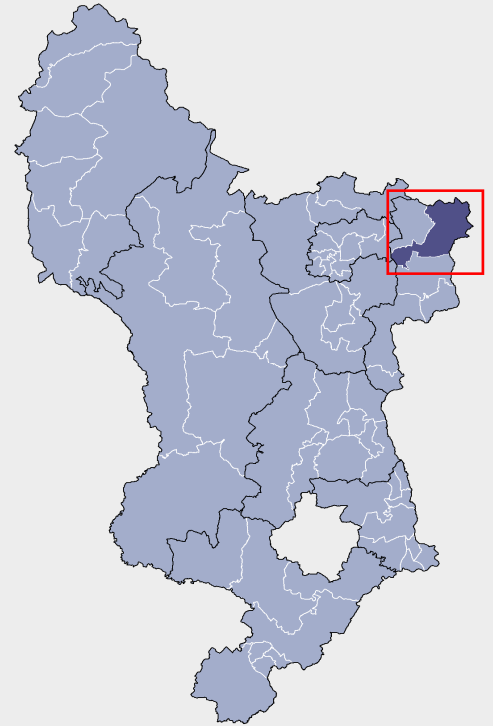
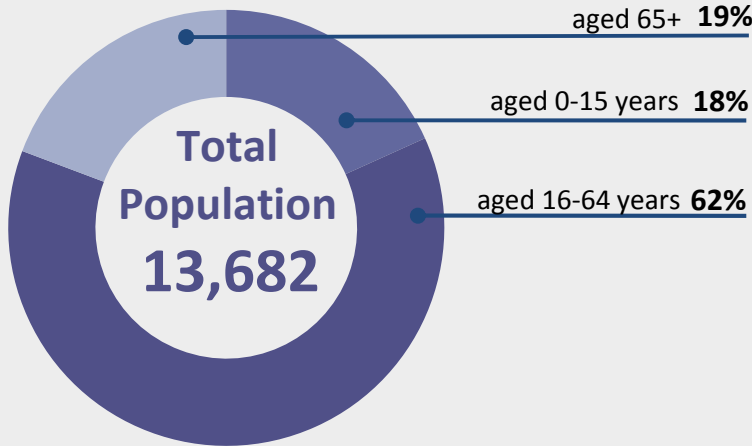


2018 Area Summary Profile Bolsover North Electoral Division



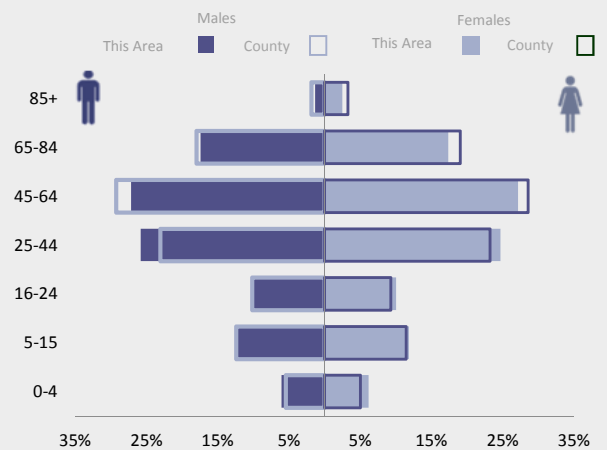

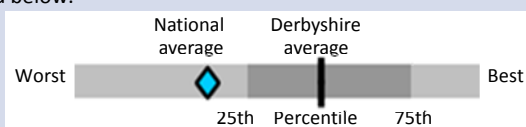
2018 Area Summary Profile

The chart below compares a range of indicators for Derbyshire.
