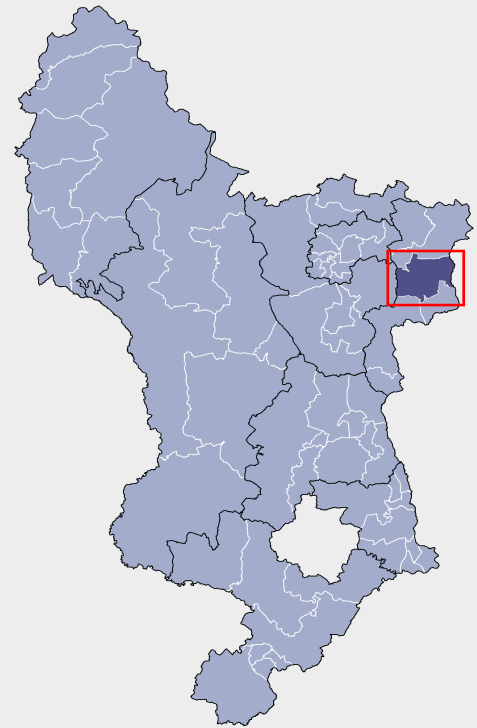
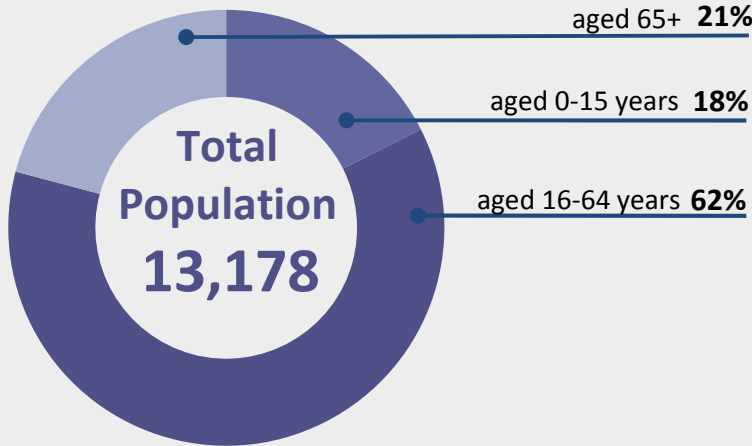


# 2018 Area Summary Profile Bolsover South Electoral Division



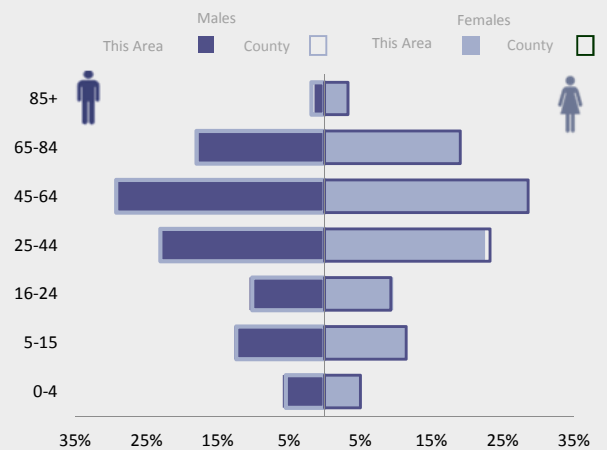

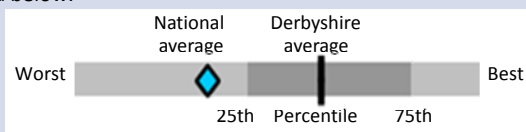
# 2018 Area Summary Profile

## Bolsover South Electoral Division



The chart below compares a range of indicators for Derbyshire.
