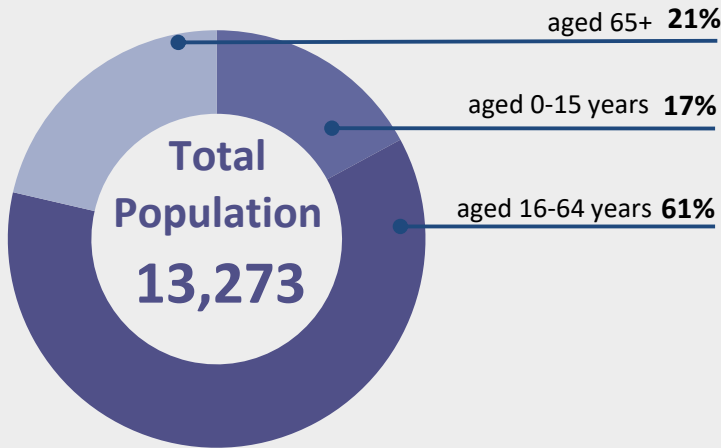
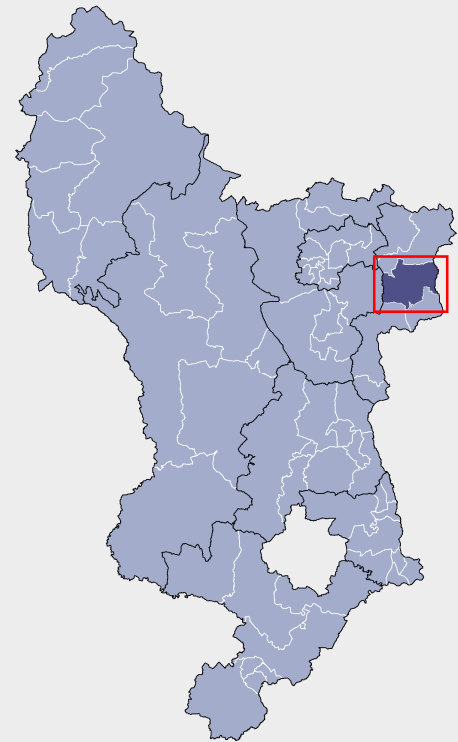


# 2021 Area Summary Profile Bolsover South Electoral Division

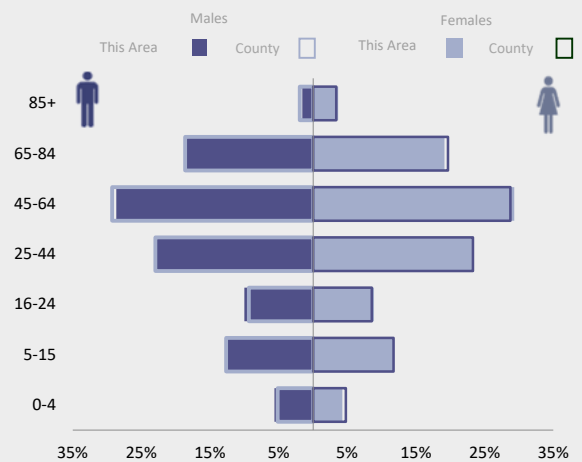

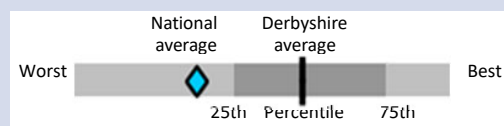
# 2021 Area Summary Profile

## Bolsover South Electoral Division
