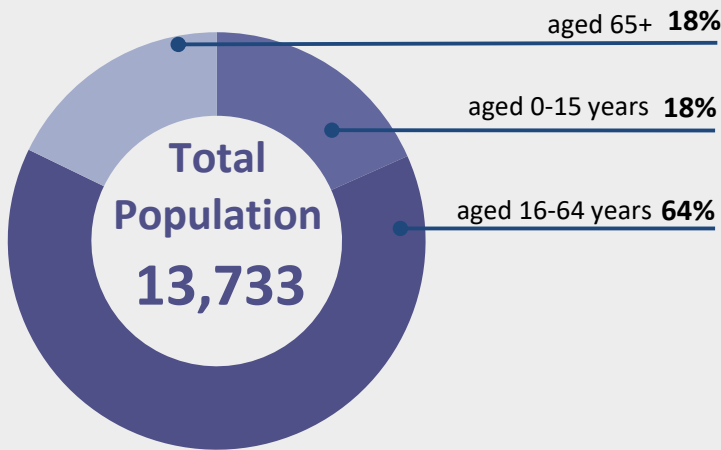
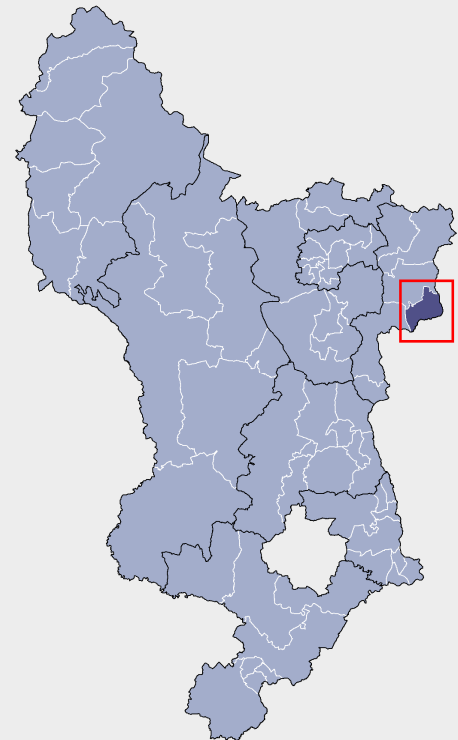


# 2021 Area Summary Profile

## Shirebrook and Pleasley Electoral Division

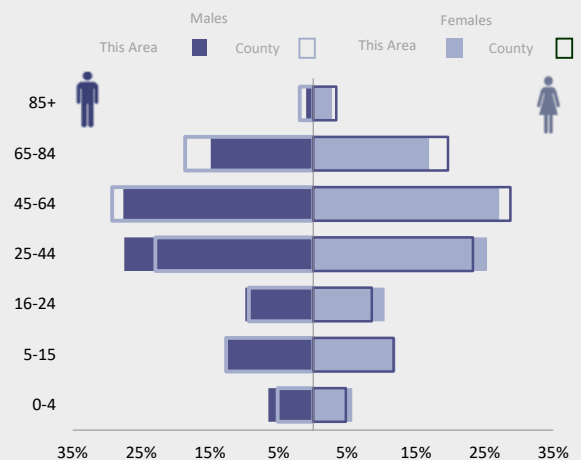

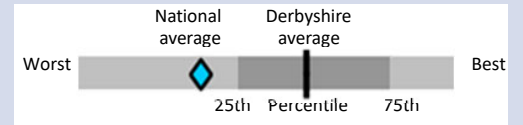

# 2021 Area Summary Profile

## Shirebrook and Pleasley Electoral Division

The chart below compares a range of indicators for Derbyshire. The local result for each indicator is shown as a circle against the range of results for the chosen local geography within Derbyshire's administrative boundary.
