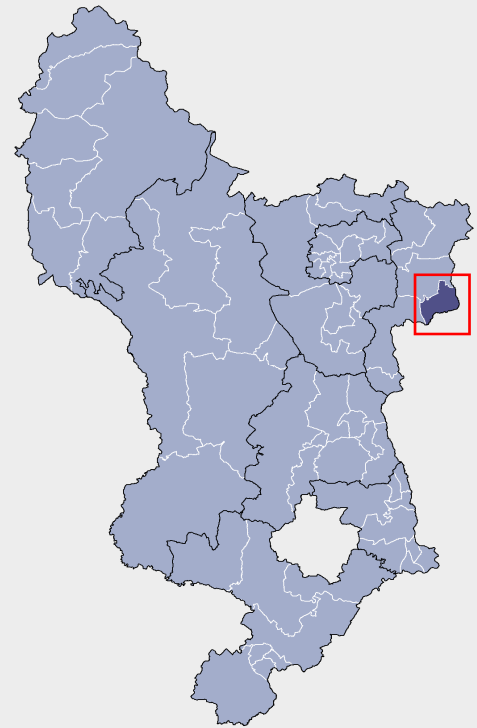
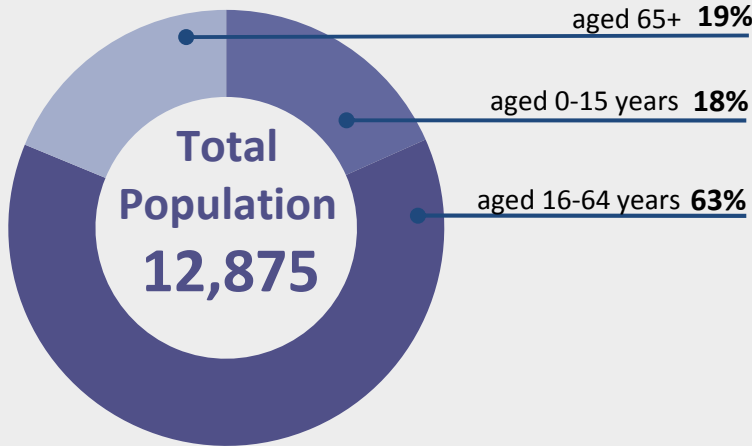

Shirebrook and Pleasley Electoral Division

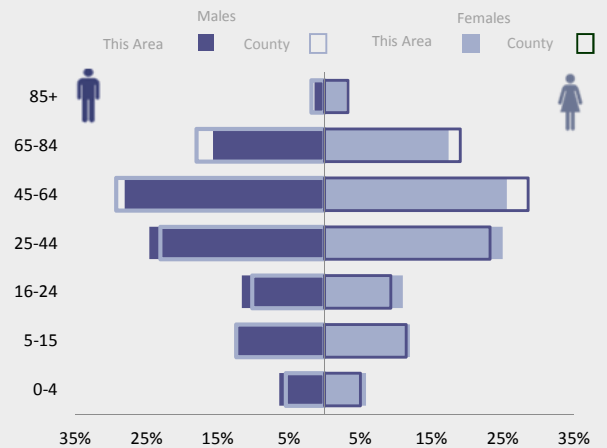

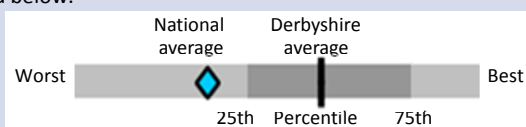
