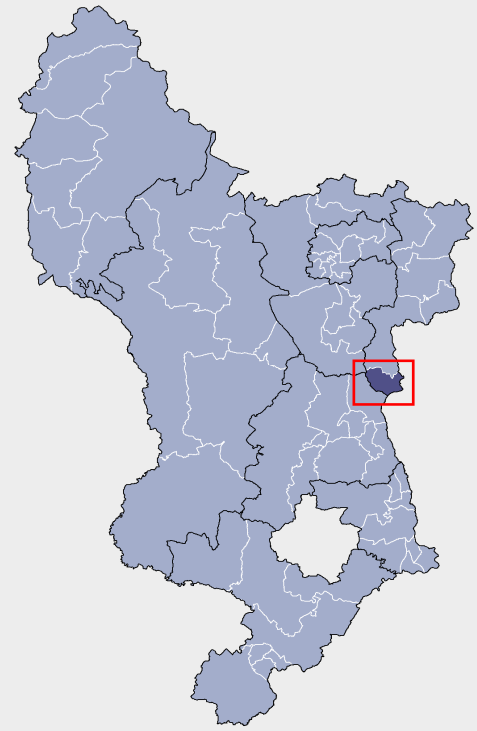
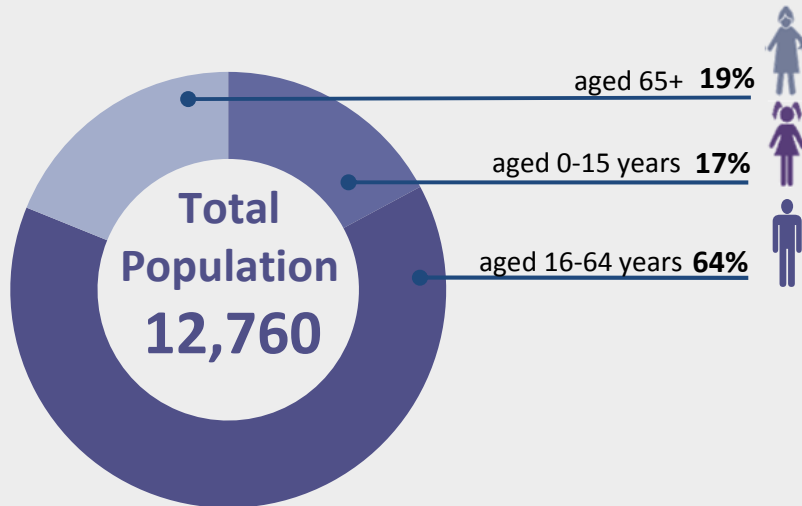

## South Normanton and Pinxton Electoral Division

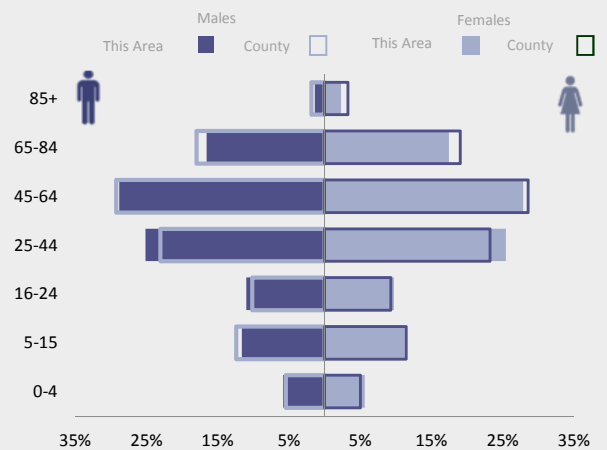

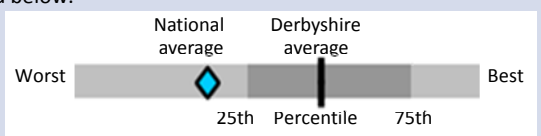
# 2018 Area Summary Profile

## South Normanton and Pinxton Electoral Division
