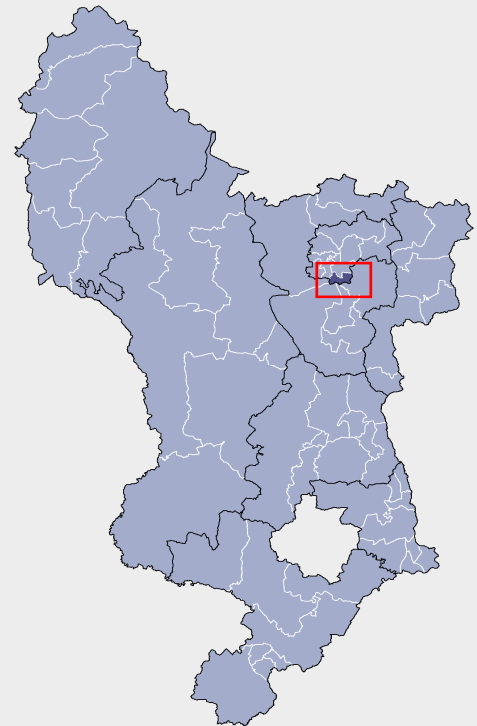
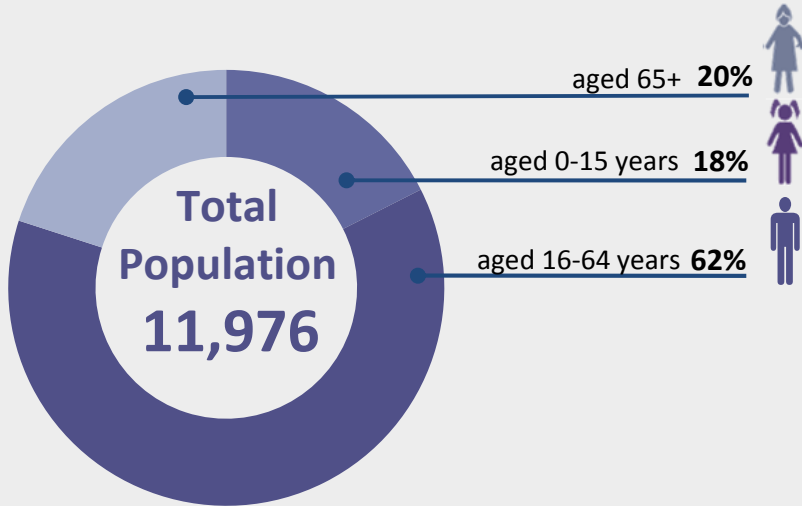


2018 Area Summary Profile Birdholme Electoral Division

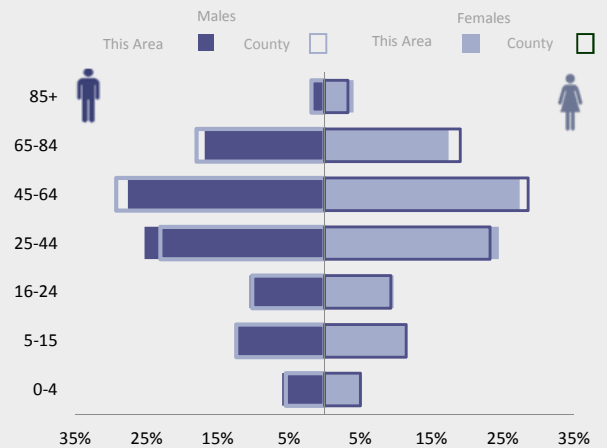

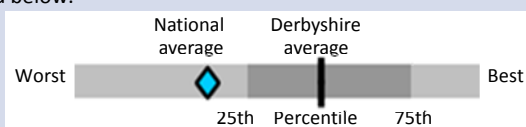
