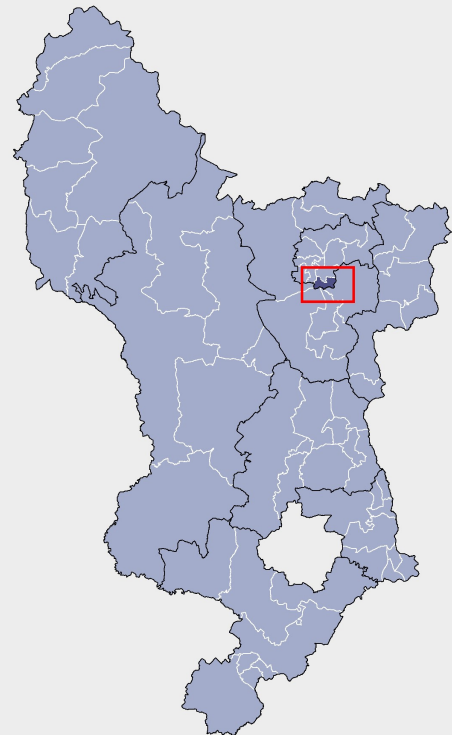
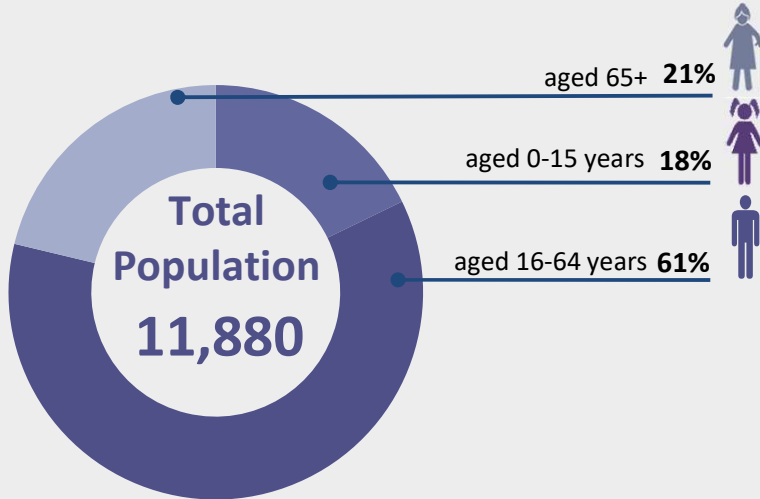


# 2023 Area Summary Profile Birdholme Electoral Division

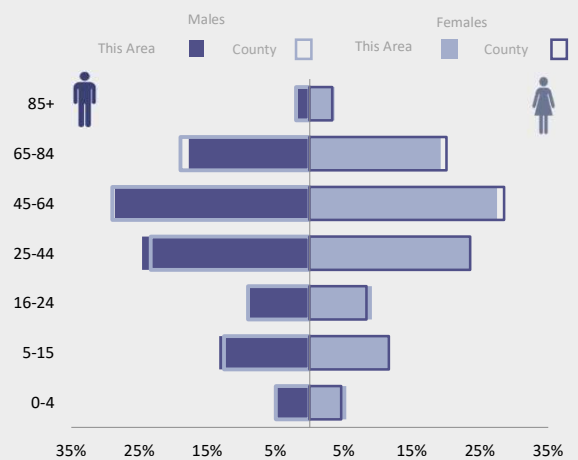

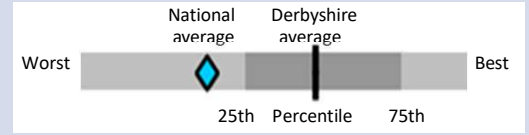
# 2023 Area Summary Profile

## Birdholme Electoral Division



The chart below compares a range of indicators for Derbyshire.
