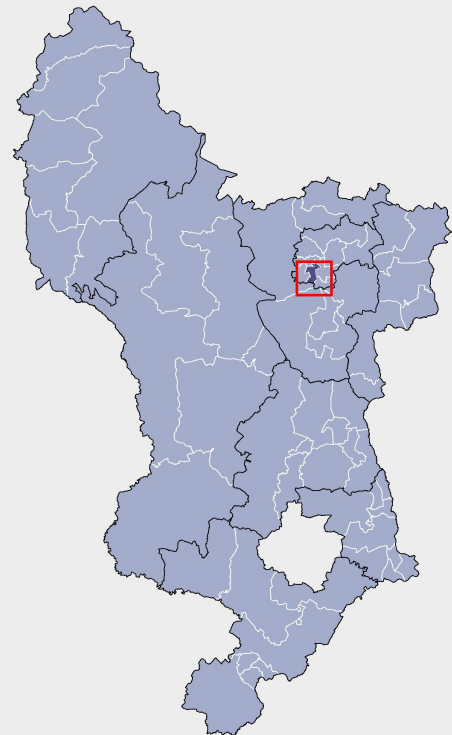
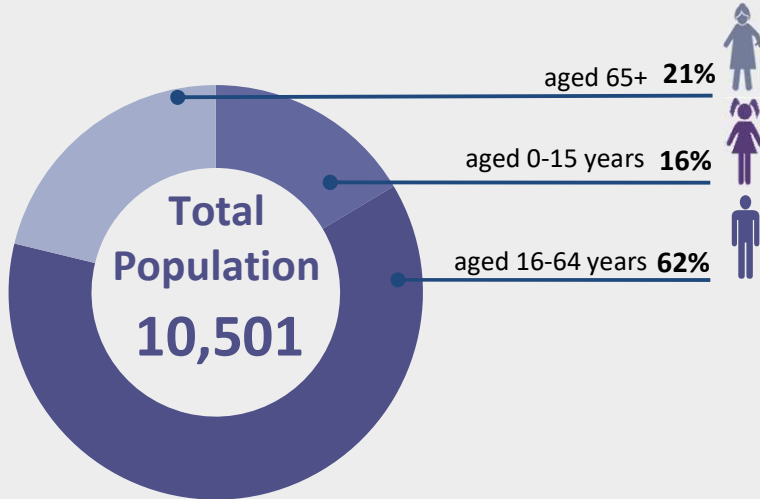

Boythorpe and Brampton South Electoral Division

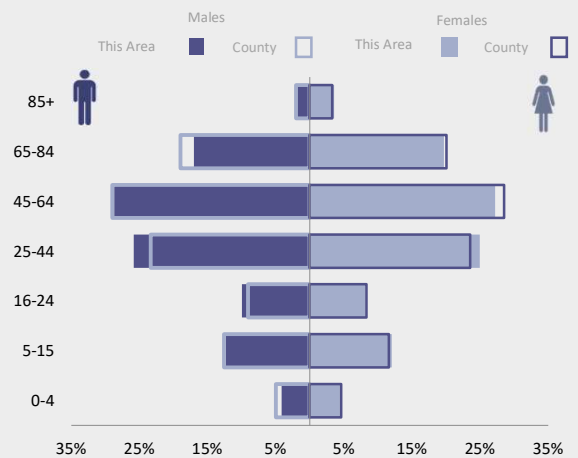

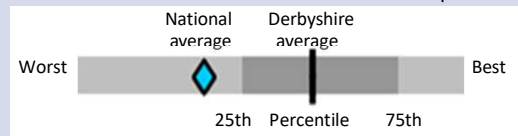
