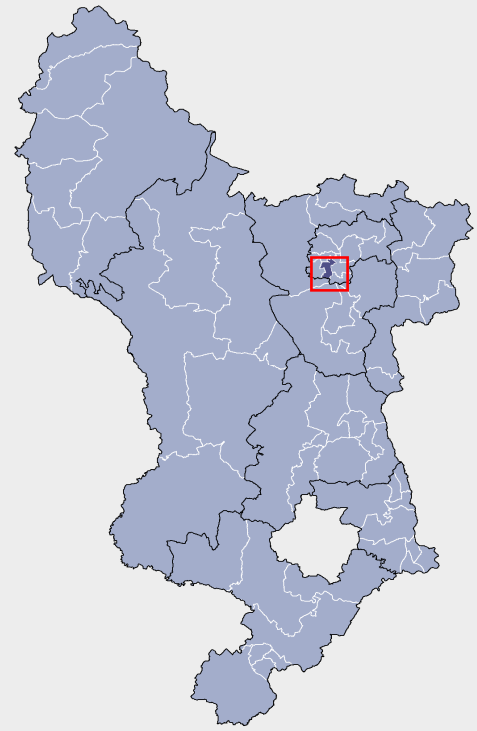
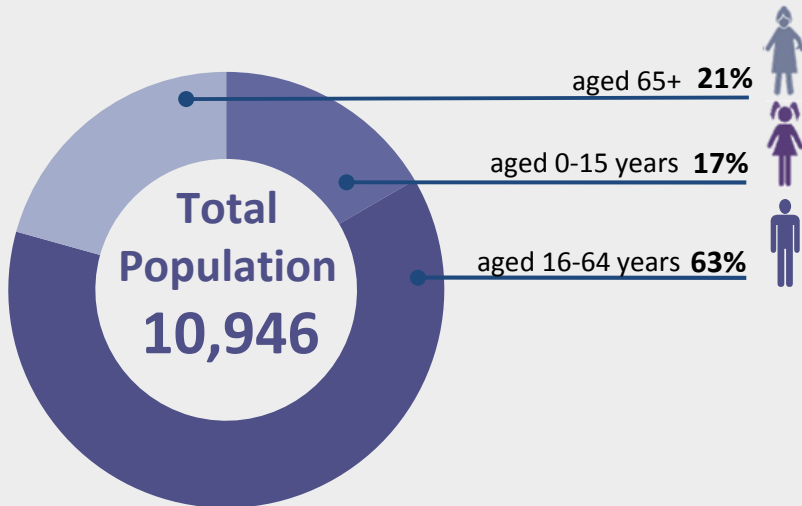


2018 Area Summary Profile Boythorpe and Brampton South Electoral Division

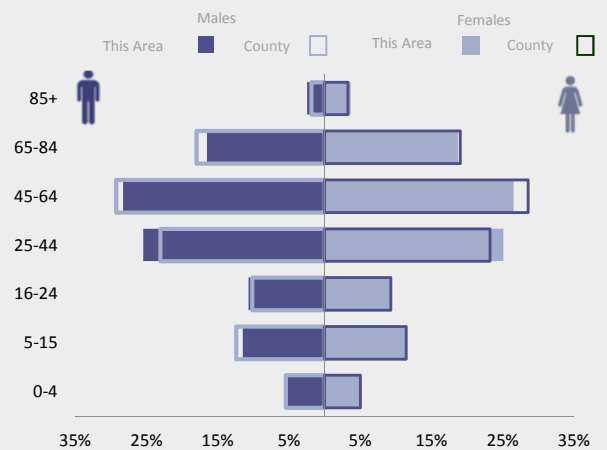

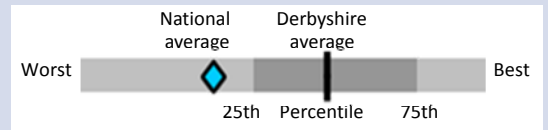
