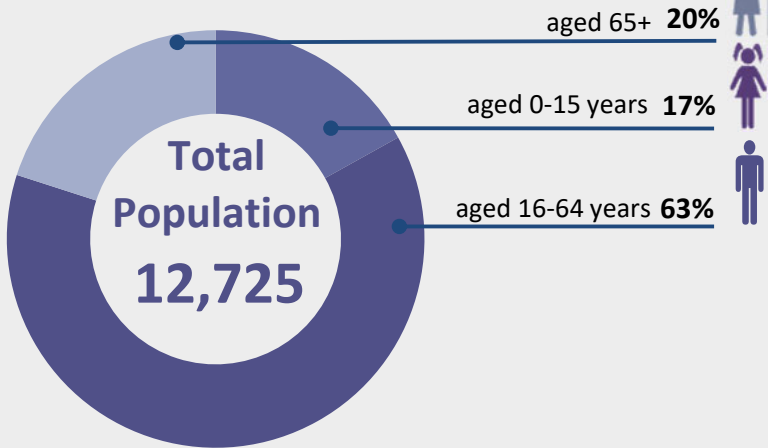
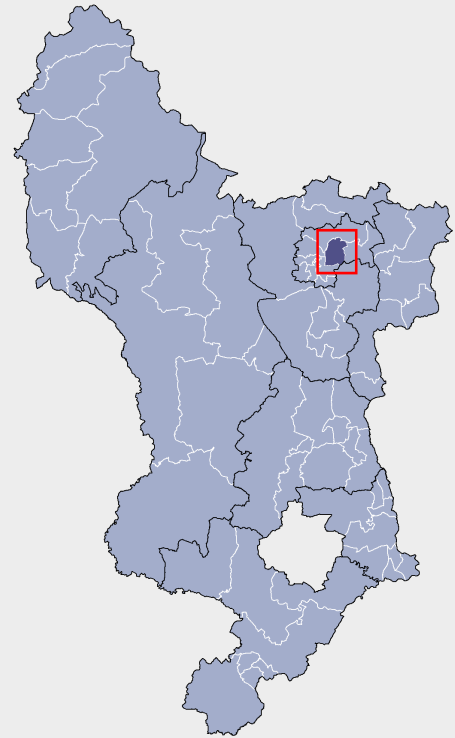


# 2021 Area Summary Profile Brimington Electoral Division

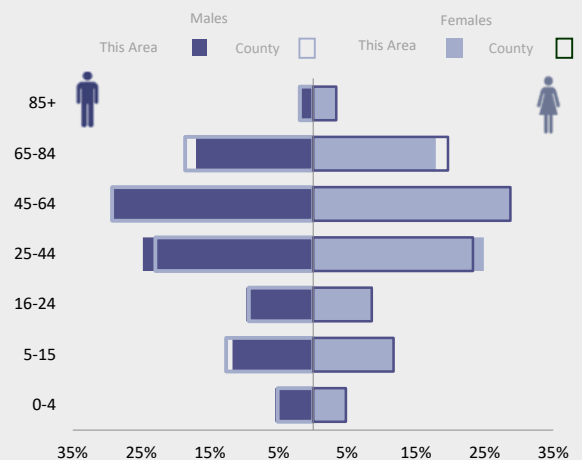

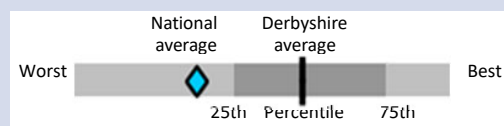
# 2021 Area Summary Profile

## Brimington Electoral Division



The chart below compares a range of indicators for Derbyshire.
