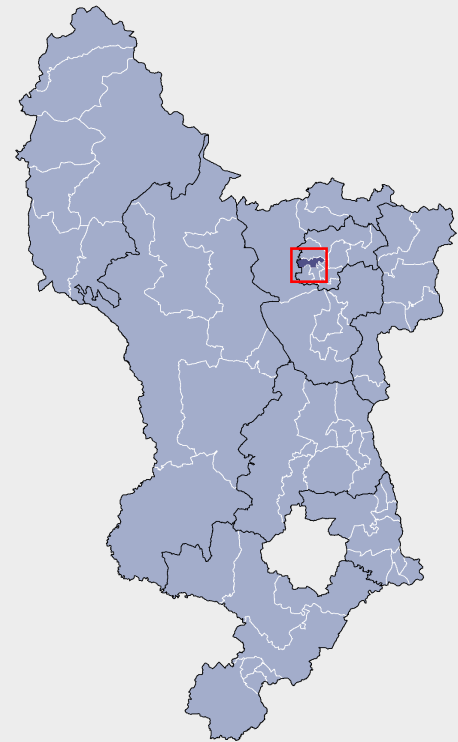
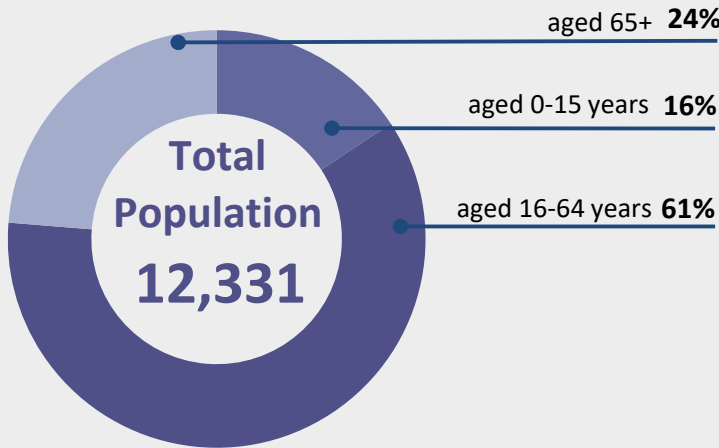

Loundsley Green and Newbold Electoral Division

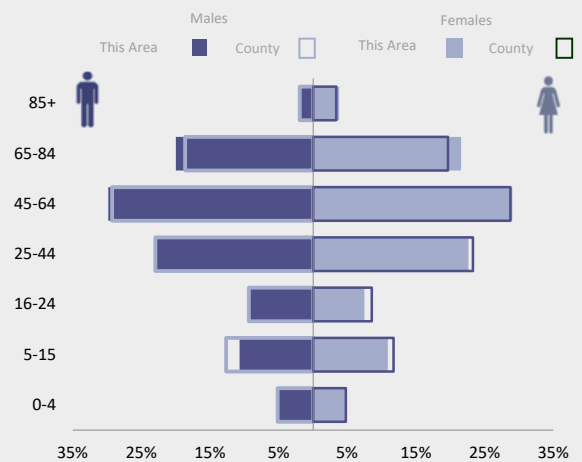

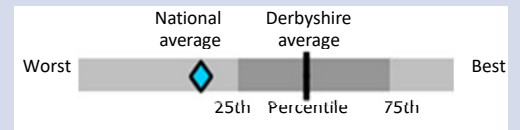
