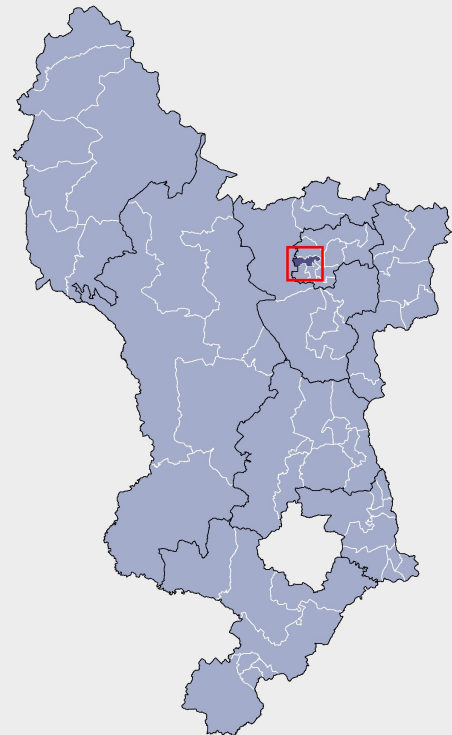
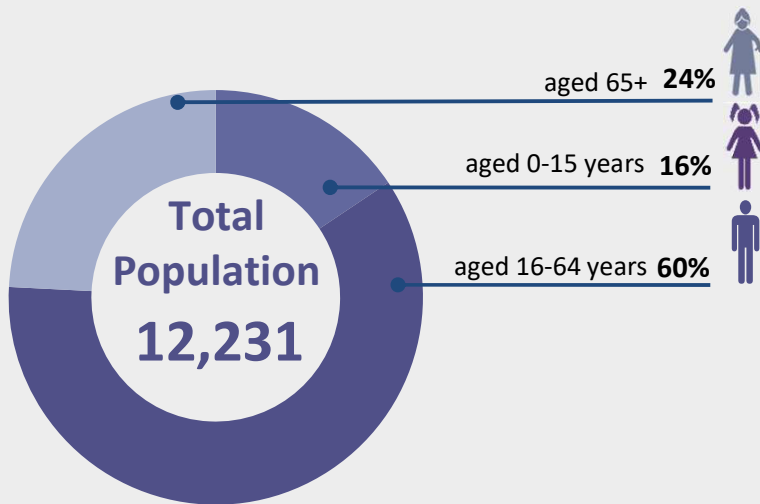

## Loundsley Green and Newbold Electoral Division

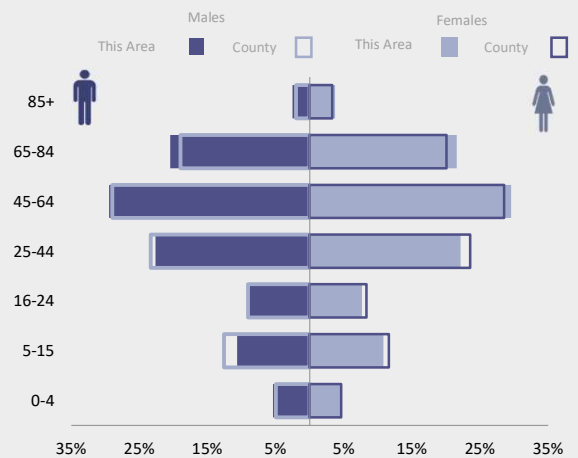

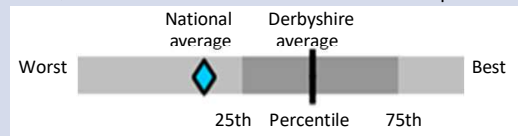
# 2023 Area Summary Profile
