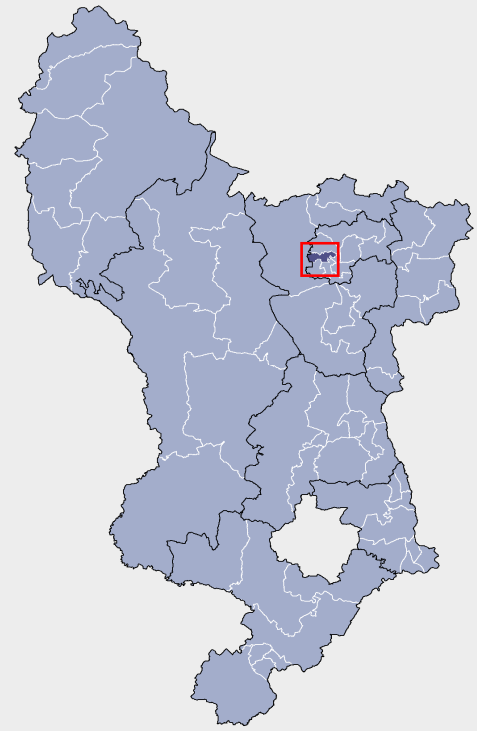
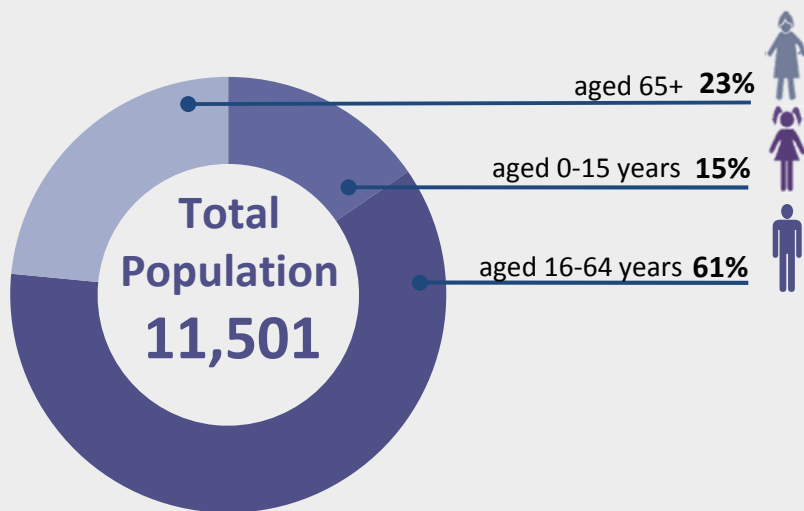

## Loundsley Green and Newbold Electoral Division

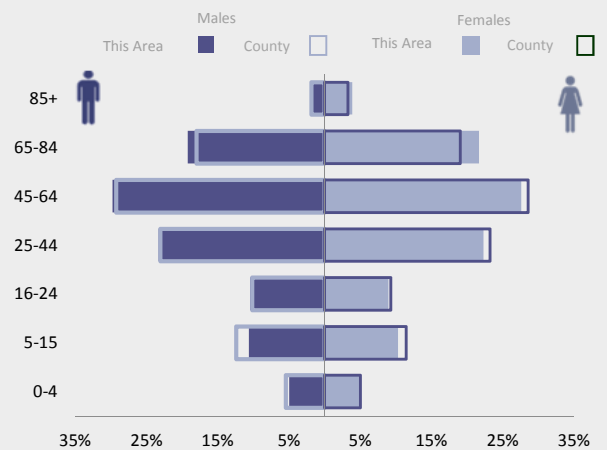

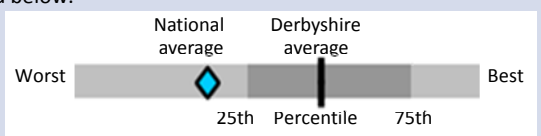
# 2018 Area Summary Profile
