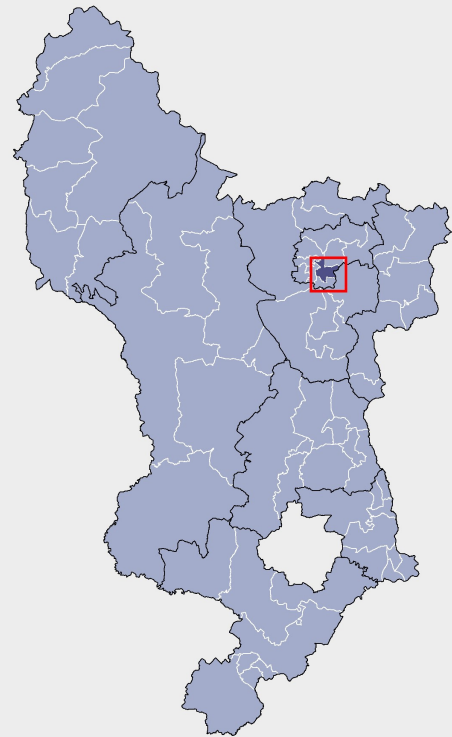
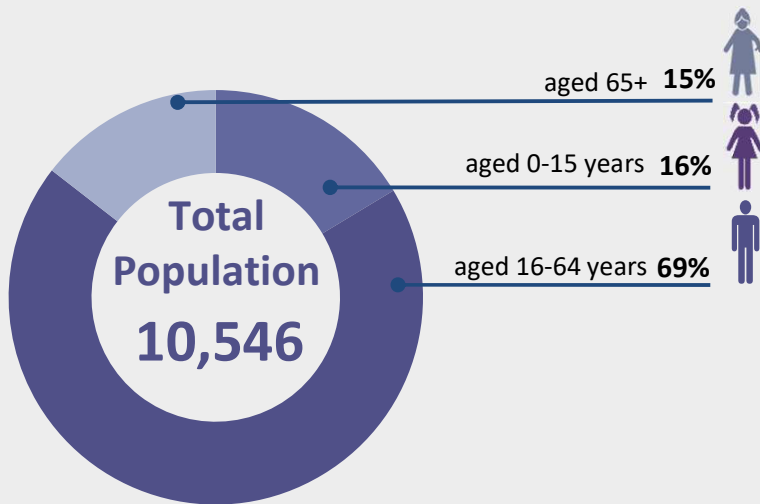


2023 Area Summary Profile Spire Electoral Division

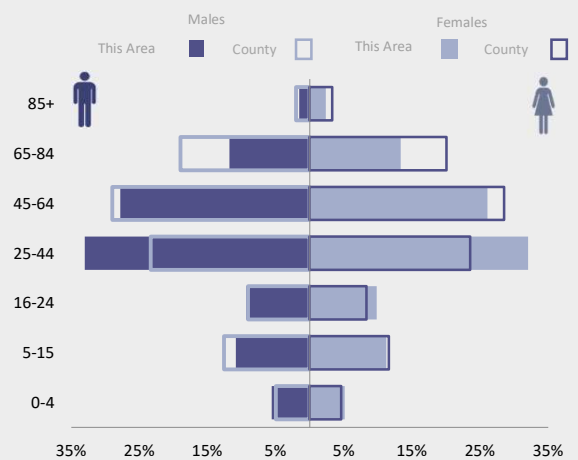

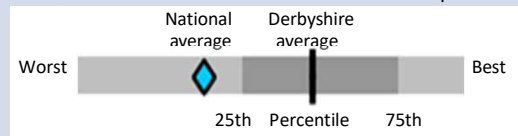
