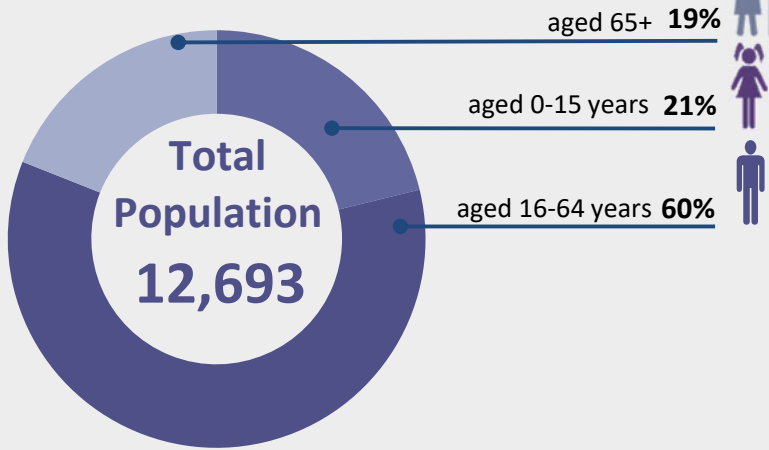
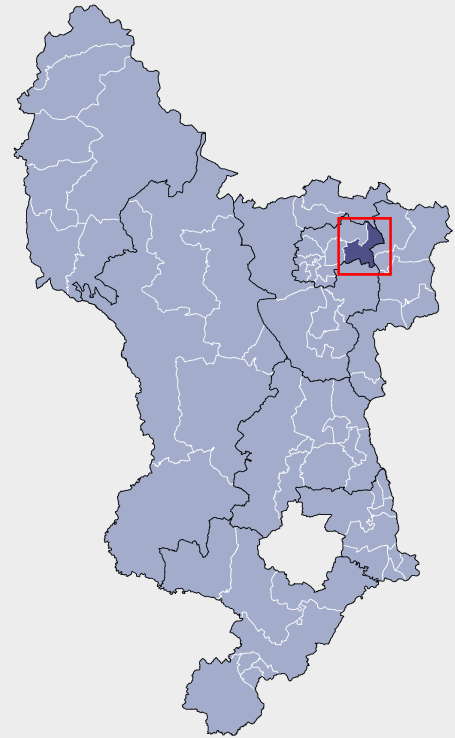


# 2021 Area Summary Profile Staveley Electoral Division



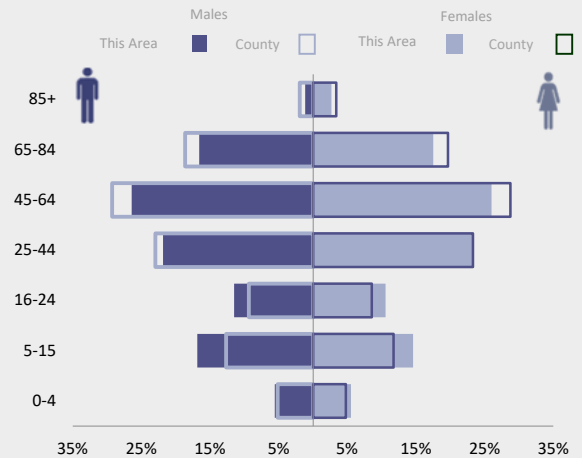

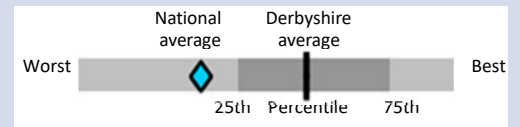
# 2021 Area Summary Profile
