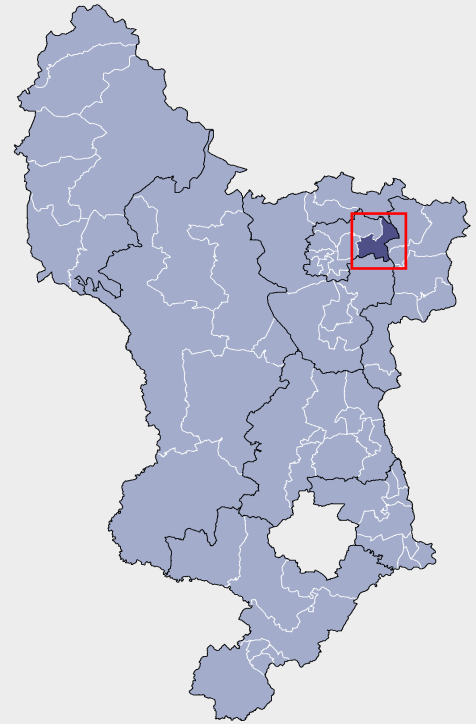
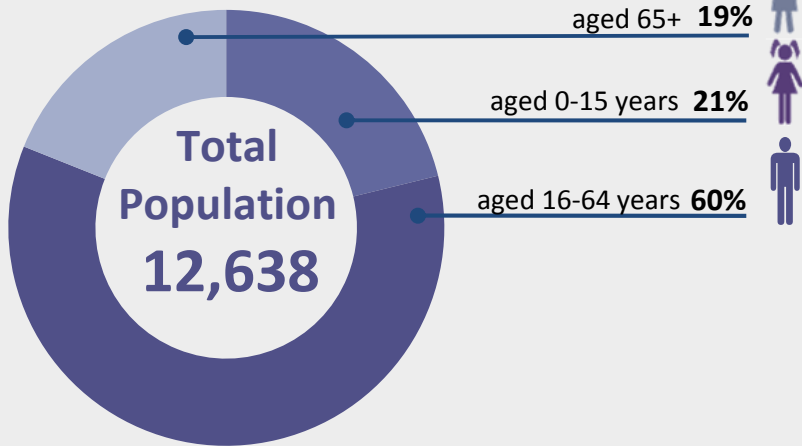


2018 Area Summary Profile Staveley Electoral Division



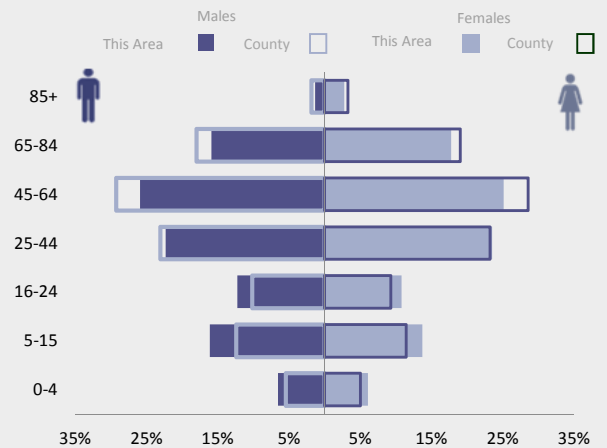

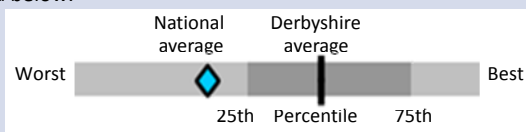
