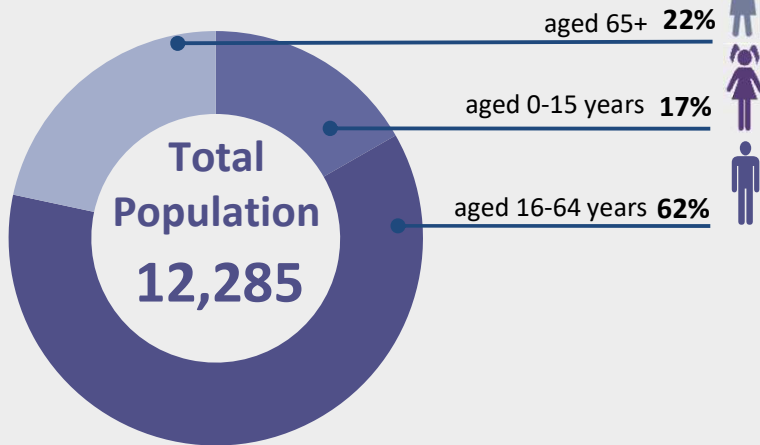
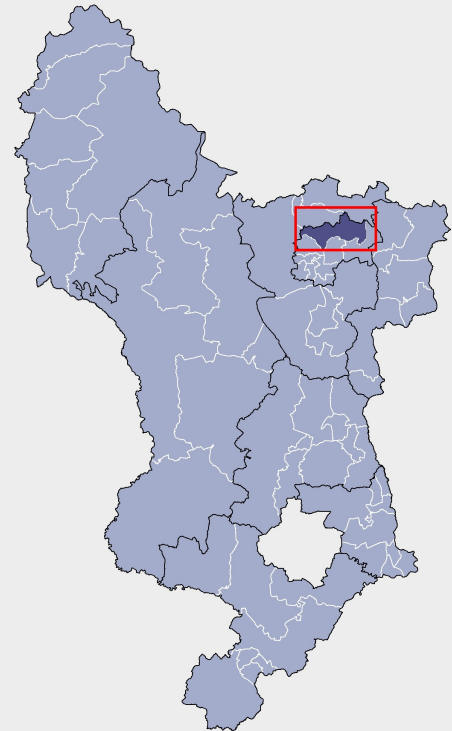


# 2023 Area Summary Profile Staveley North and Whittington Electoral Division

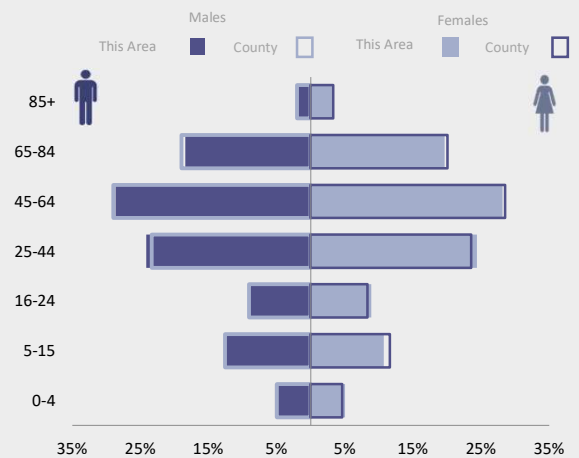

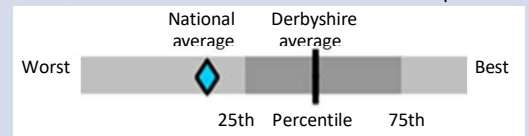
# 2023 Area Summary Profile

The chart below compares a range of indicators for Derbyshire.
