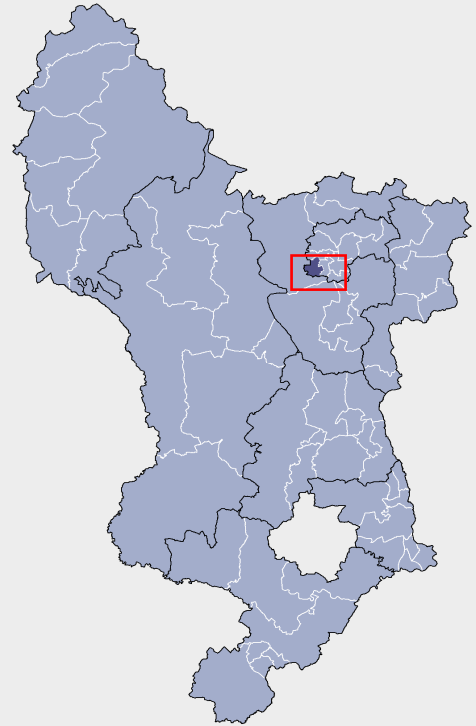
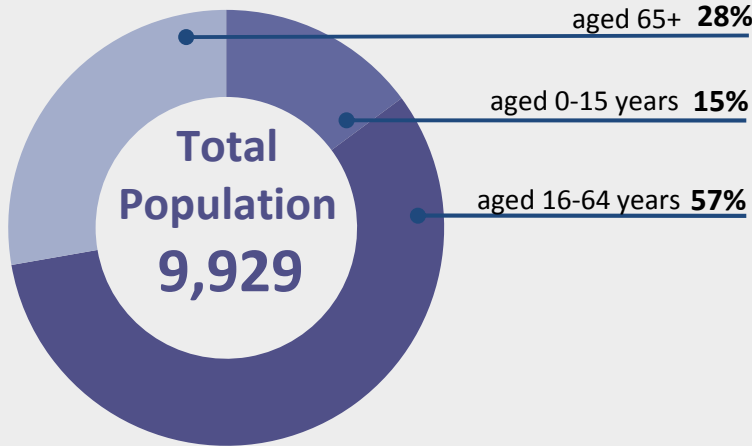


2018 Area Summary Profile Walton and West Electoral Division

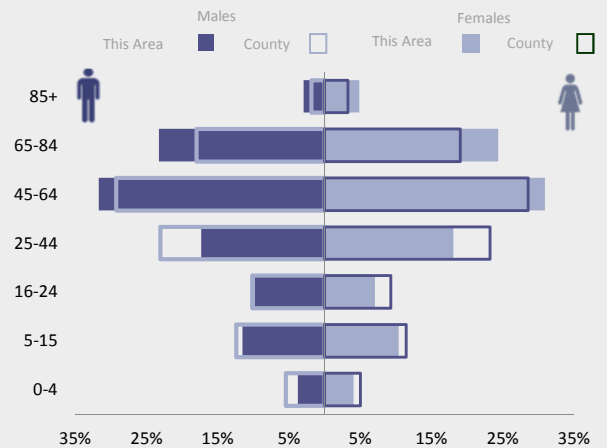


Walton and West division is urban in nature and covers the south western corner of Chesterfield. The division comprises of the majority of the West ward and part of the Walton ward.

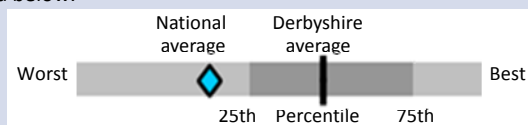

The chart below compares a range of indicators for Derbyshire.
