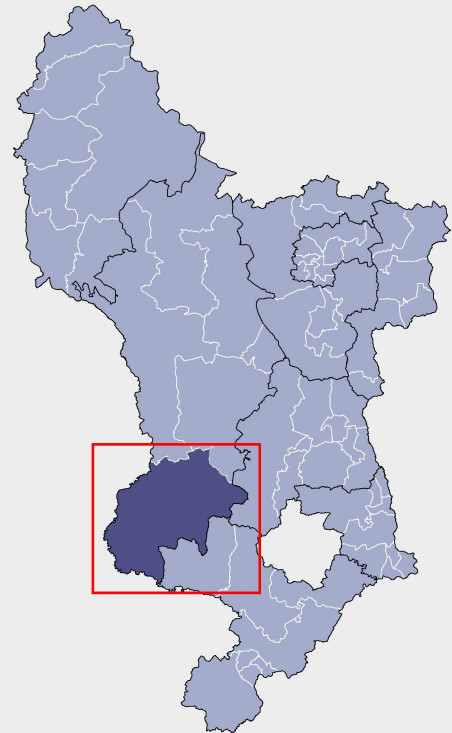
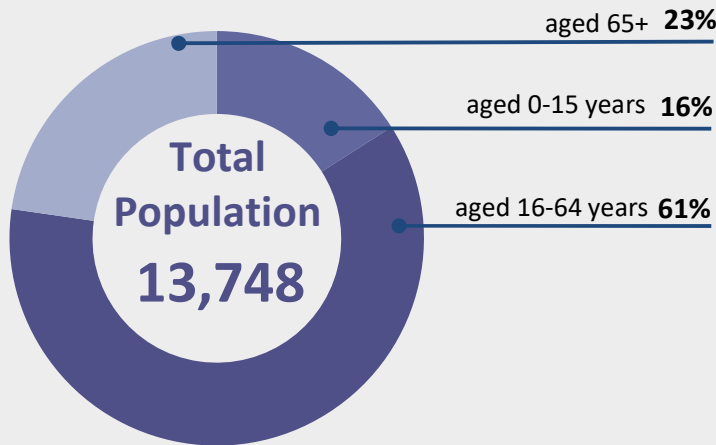


2023 Area Summary Profile Ashbourne Electoral Division

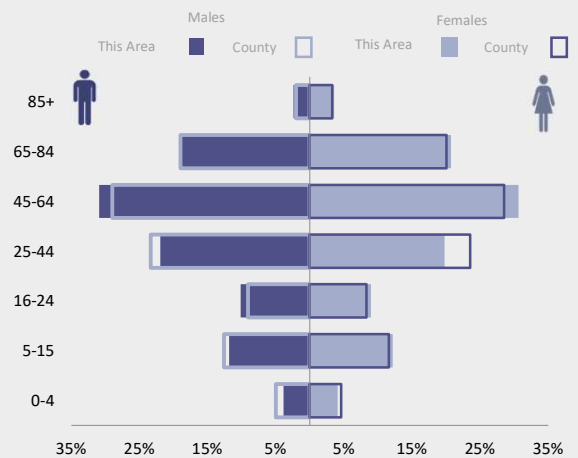

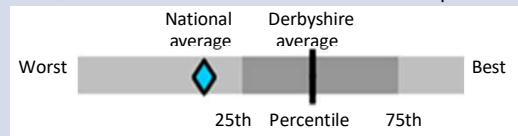
2023 Area Summary Profile

The chart below compares a range of indicators for Derbyshire.
