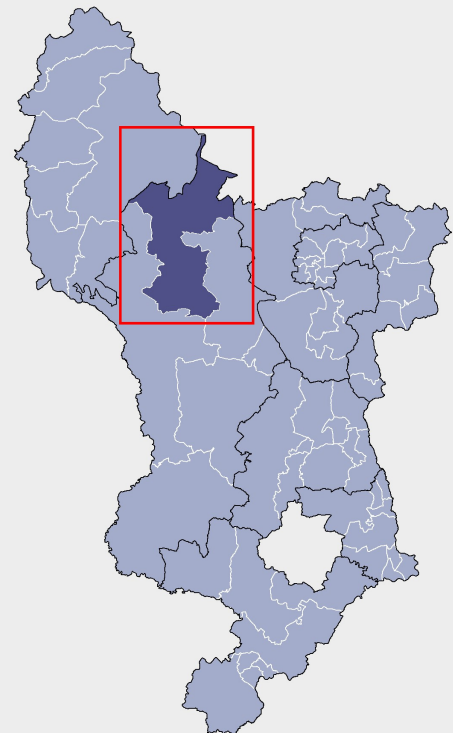
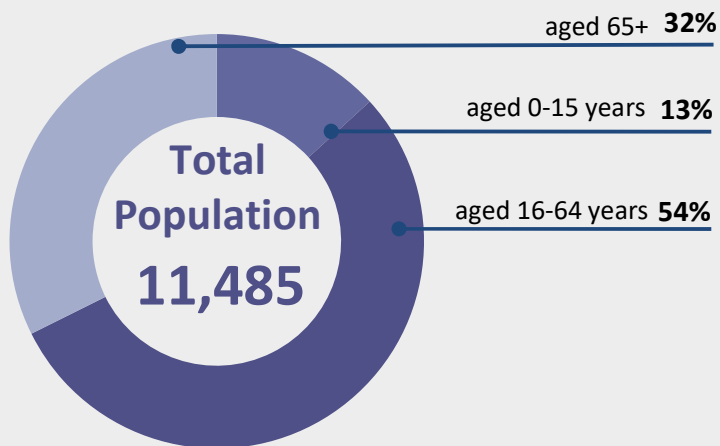


## 2023 Area Summary Profile Bakewell Electoral Division



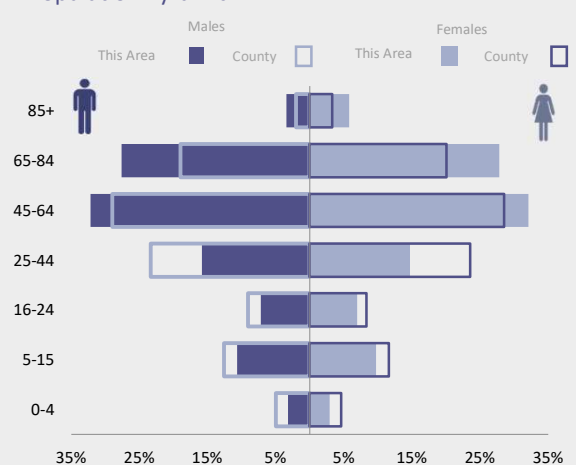

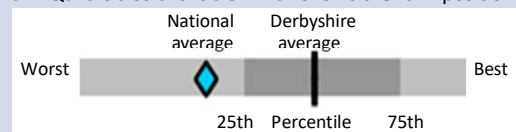
# 2023 Area Summary Profile

## Bakewell Electoral Division



The chart below compares a range of indicators for Derbyshire.
