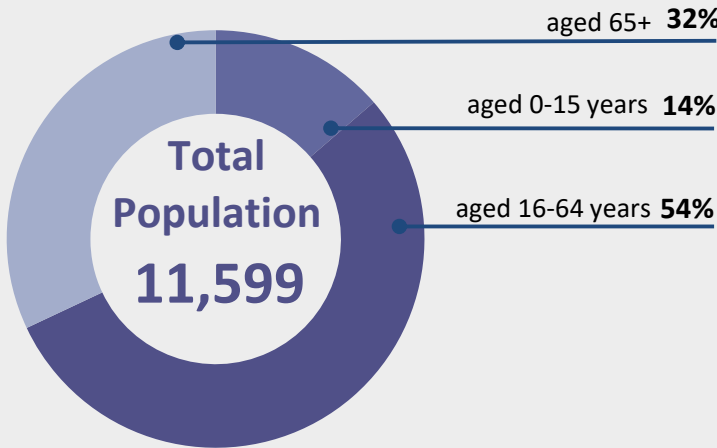
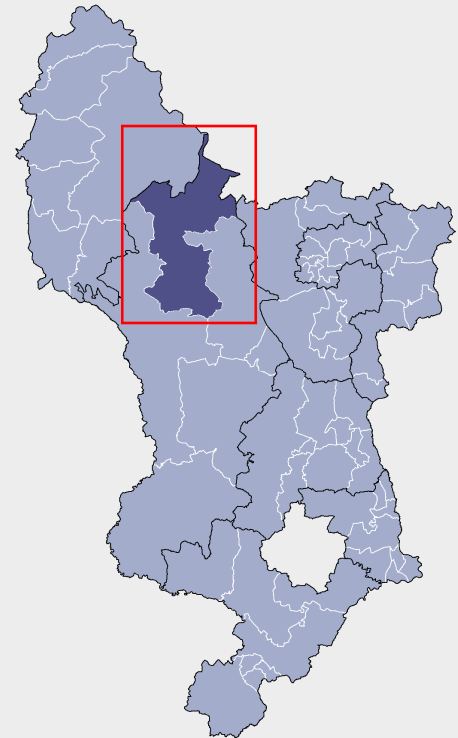


2021 Area Summary Profile Bakewell Electoral Division

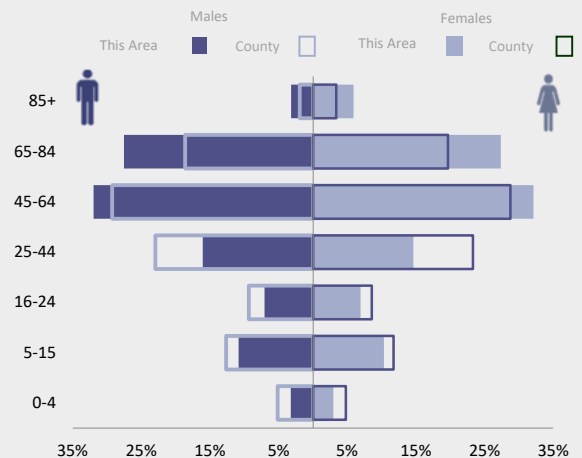

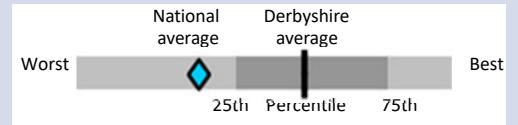

The chart below compares a range of indicators for Derbyshire.
