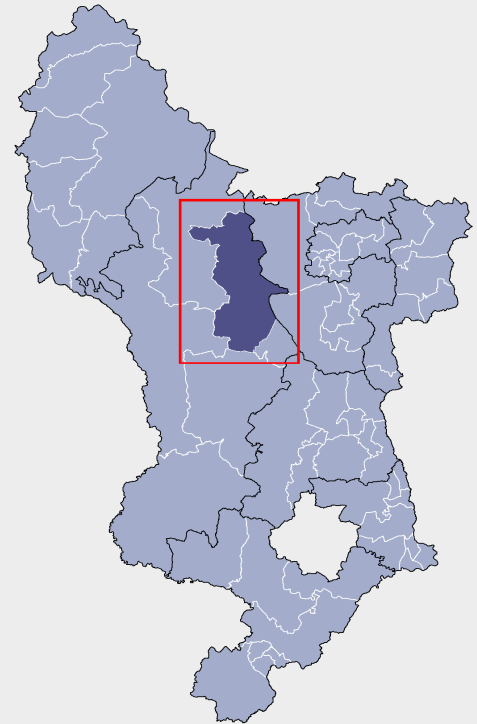
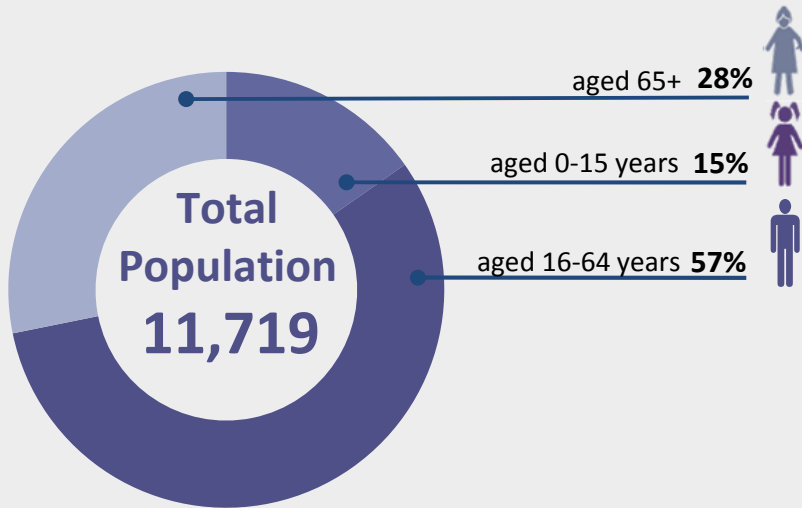


2018 Area Summary Profile Derwent Valley Electoral Division



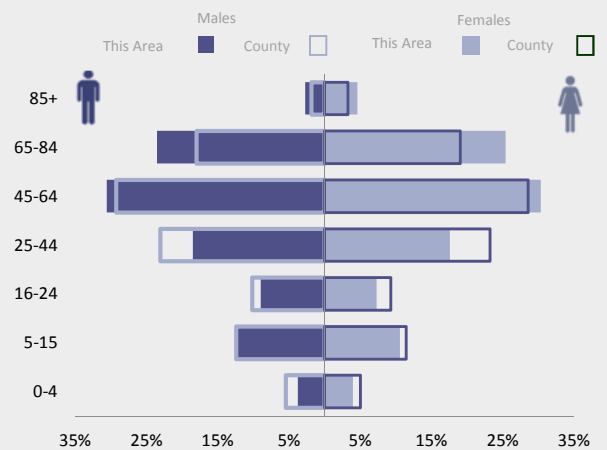

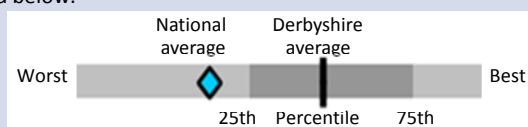

The chart below compares a range of indicators for Derbyshire.
