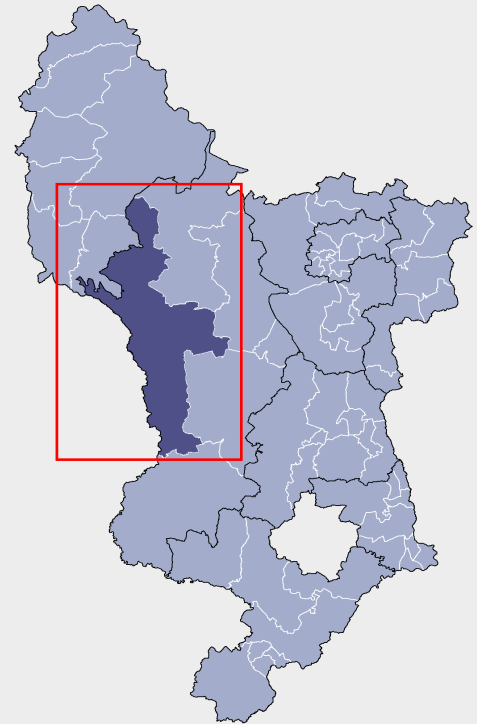
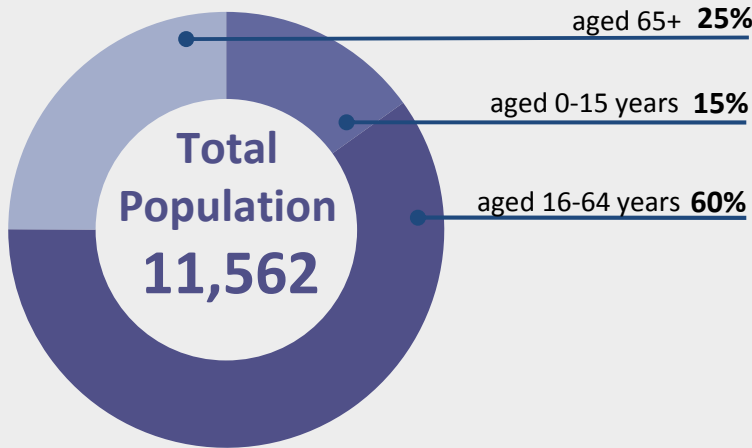


2018 Area Summary Profile Dovedale Electoral Division

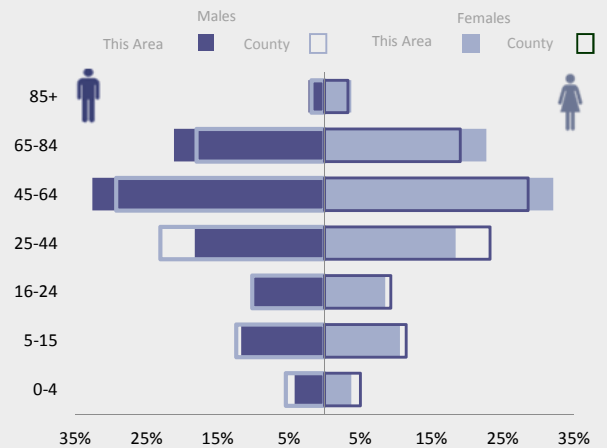

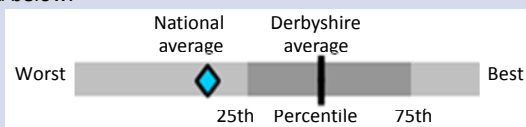

Dovedale Electoral Division



The chart below compares a range of indicators for Derbyshire.
